
Researchers Uncover Mystery of Mutations in Antibodies

Thomas Magliery, assistant professor, chemistry and biochemistry, is lead author of a study that finds the immune system not only makes changes to antibodies that enhance their ability to bind to foreign substances like viruses, but also optimizes them to be more stable. The discovery could change thinking about how the human immune system protects against foreign substances and might eventually lead to the development of better antibody-based drugs. The research is reported in the online early edition of *Proceedings* of the National Academy of Sciences.

Physicist Receives International Optical Society Award



Lou DiMauro,

professor, physics, received the 2013 William F. Meggers Award from the Optical

Society (OSA) for outstanding work in spectroscopy. The award recognizes DiMauro's contributions to precision measurements of nonsequential double ionization, exploration of strong field interaction scaling properties from mid-infrared to X-ray, and innovative experiments of time-resolved molecular imaging. OSA has 180,000 members from 175 countries.
