ALIGARH: December 27

The Vice Chancellor of Aligarh Muslim University, Prof. P. K. Abdul Azis today met the District Magistrate of Aligarh to discuss the developments pertaining to the probe since AMU S.T. High School Class X student, Saddam Husain?s kidnapping till date. Prof. Azis said that district administration should clear the position in this regard as soon as possible and expedite its search operation to find out the missing student.

The Vice Chancellor has also written a letter to the Chief Minister of Uttar Pradesh providing information in detail and highlighting the concerns of AMU fraternity in this matter. He also demanded to constitute a special task force to investigate the case on fast track basis.

Prof. Azis also visited the Jawan canal today morning and enquired about the details of search operation. He met the father of Saddam Husain today in his office and expressed deep sorrow and grief on the unfortunate incident and assured him that all efforts are on to find out about Saddam Husain. He said that whole University community is with him in the moment of anguish and distress.

The Vice Chancellor observed that the University students are busy in their examinations despite the fact that they are concerned for their fellow friend. Urging the students to have patience, Prof. Azis said that AMU administration is making all efforts to clear the position regarding Saddam Husain.

Saddam's father expressed satisfaction on the efforts made by the University in carrying search operation for his son and said that he

has come to find out in Aligarh that he is not the father of Saddam Husain only, rather all the students of this University consider him as their father. He said that the district administration should widen the its sphere of investigation as he is still doubtful that his son has been murdered. The S.T.S. High School Principal, Mr. Faisal Nafees along with others accompanied the father of Saddam Husain during his meeting with the Vice Chancellor.

The Department of Pediatrics, J. N. Medical College, Aligarh Muslim University organized a lecture by Dr. Anil Kumar Gupta, MD, Additional Project Director, Delhi AIDS Control Society on Post Exposure Prophylaxis For Management of Occupational Exposure.

Delivering the lecture, Dr. Anil Kumar Gupta said that the people working in this field are not only prone to HIV, but they are also likely to develop Hepatitis B & Hepatitis C at work place due to injuries like needle stick injury (NSI) or cut with a sharp instrument, contact with the mucous membrane of eye or mouth, contact with non-intact skin (abraded skin or with dermatitis) and contact with intact skin when the duration of contact is prolonged with blood or other potential infected body fluid.

He emphasized that the doctors and nurses along with fourth grade staffs should observe extreme care while performing activities involving needles and sharps in a hurry-handling and passing needles or sharp after use. He said that failing to dispose off used needles properly in puncture-resistant sharp containers due to poor healthcare waste-management practices and ignoring Universal Work Precautions may prove to be deadly. He however said that one should not panic and three drug regimen (Zidovudine, Lamivudine & Efavirenz) should be used by the people exposed to sick HIV-positive persons.

The lecture was followed by an interactive session with the faculty members and students.

Earlier, Prof. S. Manazir Ali, Chairman, Department of Pediatrics welcomed the members of Surgery, Medicine, Dermatology, Microbiology, TB & Chest, Obstetrics & Gynaecology, ART (Antiretroviral Treatment Centre) and the residents of Department of Pediatrics and introduced Dr. Anil Kumar Gupta. Prof. Ali pointed out that around 400 children have been enrolled with ART Centre till date and at least around 1-2 babies are born to HIV positive mothers in Obstetrics & Gynaecology Department.

Prof. Manazir Ali thanked Prof. Abida Malik, Dean, Faculty of Medicine and Prof. M. Ashraf Malik, Principal & CMS, J. N. Medical College for sparing valuable time. The rarest manuscript that consists of letters, speeches and aphorism of Hazrat Ali, the fourth Caliphate of Islam has been published as a joint venture of AMU and Iran.

Dr. Wilayati announced that the Urdu, Hindi and English versions of this oldest manuscript will be published by the Aligarh Muslim University and the Government of Iran will provide all the financial support.

He said that India and Iran are two ancient nations with long history of cultural relations. He said that today his dream to attend a function of this great institution of Islamic values has come true. He hoped Iran and the Aligarh Muslim University will come closer in the field of education and research.

Dr. Ali Akbar Wilayati has served as the Foreign Minister of Iran from 1981 to 1997. Currently he is an advisor in international affairs to the supreme leader Ayatollah Ali Khamenei of Iran. He is a medical graduate from John Hopkins University, USA and has about 68 books and 150 articles to his credit.

"Lemongrass is commonly used in making teas, soups, and curries. Its oil is also suitable for soap industries and synthesis of vitamin A. Furthermore, it relieves cough and nasal congestion besides keeping mosquitoes away", said Dr. Mohd. Masroor Akhtar Khan, Associate Professor, Department of Botany, Aligarh Muslim University while delivering lecture at the Euro-Mediterranean Conference on "Plant Natural Products" at Alexandria University, Egypt.

Dr. Khan chaired a session of the conference and presented an invited talk on his work on increasing the production of lemongrass and its essential oil using the gamma radiation technique, which is inexpensive and ergonomically safe and feasible.

The Department of Community Medicine, J. N. Medical College, has been granted a project entitled "Survey for prevalence of refractive errors and colour blindness among school children in Aligarh" by Director General of Health Services (Ophthalmic Division), Ministry of Health and Family Welfare, Govt. of India, New Delhi.

For the survey, 15 schools in 5 tehsils of Aligarh; Kol, Gabhana, Iglas, Khair and Atrauli have been selected randomly and nearly 3000 children in the age group of 6-14 years will be examined for refractive errors and colour blindness.

A team of doctors from Department of Community Medicine and Ophthalmology, medico-social workers and optometrist has started the survey from Primary School in Jawan of Gabhana tehsil. For the supervision of the activity, Prof. Zulfia Khan, Dr. A.R. Siddiqui, Dr. Anees Ahmad have been working as co-investigators and Dr. M. Athar Ansari, Coordinator, Sentinel Surveillance Unit (SSU) under National Programme for Control of Blindness, Directorate General of Health Services (Ophthalmic Division), Ministry of Health and Family Welfare, Govt. of India, New Delhi will work as Principal Investigator. All the necessary clinical arrangements have been made by Prof. R.R. Sukul, Director, Institute of Ophthalmology.

A training of health workers was carried out in the Department of Community Medicine followed by a pilot survey by the participants. The students found suffering from refractive errors, will be provided spectacles free of cost. The report of the survey will be

submitted to the Director General of Health Services (Ophthalmic Division), Ministry of Health and Family Welfare, Govt. of India, New Delhi for necessary action. **Related Picture**

Abdul Azis to finalize the names of five candidates one of whom would be chosen his successor, to the post of AMU VC is completely baseless and not based on the orders of the Hon?ble High Court.

A special meeting of the Academic Council of the Aligarh Muslim University under the Chairmanship of the AMU Vice Chancellor, Prof. P. K. Abdul Azis today discussed the issue of National Eligibility-cum-Entrance Test for undergraduates for admission to MBBS course accredited by the Medical Council of India for the session 2012-13.

The meeting of the Academic Council Unanimously resolved to seek exemption of the J. N. Medical College of the University from the proposed National Eligibility Test for admission to MBBS in view of its historic minority character and the status quo directive of the Supreme Court.

It is to be noted that the Government of India treats AMU as a religious minority institution established and administered under Section 30(1) of the Constitution of India. In the light of the autonomy guaranteed by AMU Act, the Council viewed the notification made by MCI as an infringement of the stake involved of the Muslim community and the AMU on a long term basis from the notified MBBS National Eligibility-cum-Entrance Test.

It is also mentioned that the Aligarh Muslim University, established by an Act of Parliament in 1920 which has been amended several times till date, empowers the University to promote especially the educational and cultural advancement of Muslims of India.

The Academic Council of the University urged the Medical Council of India to exempt the University from proposed National Eligibility-cum-Entrance Test as the Supreme Court is also seized with issue of AMU minority status case in the civil appeal of 2006.

The University's resolution also mentioned that the Supreme Court has granted status quo and the introduction of the abovementioned entrance test for J. N. medical College will violate the status quo order passed by the Hon?ble Supreme Court on April 24, 2006. The Academic Council has urged the University to take up all necessary measures to preserve autonomy and minority character of AMU. It has constituted a high power committee under the Chairmanship of Prof. M. H. Beg, Dean, Faculty of Medicine to meet government authorities and MCI officials and seek support for exemption to the J. N. Medical College.

ALIGARH: December 09

The Vice Chancellor of Aligarh Muslim University, Prof. P. K. Abdul Azis today dedicated the facility of 3G and Wi Max to students, staff and retired employees of the University.

Registrar, Prof. V. K. Abdul Jaleel said that the J. N. Medical College is very serious to take up malnutrition. He appreciated the efforts of the Chairman of the Department, Prof. S. Manazir Ali to this effect. Prof. Jaleel also inaugurated the seminar room of Paediatrics Ward

Prof. M. H. Beg, Dean, Faculty of Medicine said that department of Paediatrics is one of the leading Paediatrics department of north India with dedicated staff and good infrastructure he said it has been playing a leading role in the

ongoing collaborative project between AMU and UNICEF. Prof. Beg hoped that the establishment of Malnutrition Treatment Unit will help eradicate the problem of malnutrition.

Prof. S. Manazir Ali, Chairman, Department of Paediatrics said that malnutrition is more common in India than in Sub-Saharan African countries. One in every three malnourished children in the world lives in India. Prof. Manazir said that 22 lacs children die under age of 5 years every year in India and 5% children below five years are severely malnourished in Uttar Pradesh. Prof. Ali said malnutrition has real and far-reaching implications as it lessens children?s ability to fight common childhood disease, impairs their learning ability and adversely affect their physical work capacity. Prof. Manazir said that the department emphasizing on prevention, promotion through health education and treatment at the community level. He said the Department already has a resource centre for UNICEF sponsored project.

Teesta Setalwad was delivering a lecture on "Violence and Minorities" organized by the Club for Short Evening Courses, General Education Centre, Aligarh Muslim University here on today. Setelvad said that from Gujarat to Karnataka, Gopalganj and Bharatpur, all the incidents of riot proved that the police stance remains against Muslims. She observed that in all these riots, Muslims were first provoked then firing was resorted upon them and their properties were looted and put on fire. She said that proofs of such incidents were hurriedly wiped out so that they might not be used to get an FIR lodged or presented in courts. About 500 students of 3-7 years of age were examined for various Dental ailments. Students were also educated on oral hygiene practices including the brushing techniques.

Dr. M. K. Jindal, Associate Professor, Department of Pedodontics and Programme Coordinator said that the aim of this program was to examine the students, spread awareness and educate the children on the dental health. He said that dental health is as essential as the total body health and it is necessary to be vigilant of dental health for the overall well being of the person.

Dr. Jindal said that after the examination and assessment of the students, it was observed that 22% of the students had dental diseases whereas 55% students had satisfactory oral hygiene and the remaining 23% students enjoyed good oral hygiene. It was revealed that the excessive consumption of chocolates, toffees and other sweets were the main factors for the development of dental caries in the children belonging to the high socio-economic status. Oral trauma was mainly due to the lack of safety during

outdoor activities, whereas the poor oral hygiene was mainly due to the lack of knowledge of technique and frequency of brushing due to the lack of parent's attention, Dr. Jindal observed.

In this program, the students were educated through the audiovisual aids which included the Power Point presentations & teeth models.

The programme was conducted under the guidance of Prof. S. H. Hashmi, Principal. Dr. Ziauddin Ahmad Dental College. Prof. Rais Akhtar, Visiting Professor, Department of Geology participated in the DST Sponsored discussion on Impacts of Extreme Weather Events and Climate Change on Human Health organized at the Centre for Atmospheric Sciences, Indian Institute of Technology, Delhi.

Prof. Akhtar also presented his paper on climate change and communicable diseases with focus on malaria. His findings, based on all India figures for Average Mean Temperature and Percentage of Plasmodium falciparum cases, suggest that increase in the Plasmodiun falciparum cases in certain geographical regions in India-eastern coastal areas and the North-East is the result of increased average mean temperature. Prof. Akhtar has also highlighted the problem of altitudinal rise of malaria in mountainous regions as witnessed in studies conducted by scientists on African highland regions of Kenya and Zimbabwe.

Among others, Director General ICMR, Dr. V. M. Katoch, Secretary, Ministry of Earth Sciences and Secretary, Department

of Science & Technology, Government of India participated in the concluding session of the discussion.

"The ulcerative colitis disease in large intestine might lead to cancer if persisted for long. The early diagnosis and treatment can control the disease", said Dr. Alfonso Caprea, Head of Endoscopy and Gastroenterology, University Hospital, Pisa, Italy, while delivering the guest lecturer at the Department of Medicine, JN Medical College, Aligarh Muslim University.

Dr. Alfonso Caprea said that ulcerative colitis occurs in 35?100 people for every 100,000 in the United States. The disease is more prevalent in northern countries of the world, as well as in northern areas of individual countries or other regions. He further added that Ulcerative colitis is a chronic inflammation of the large intestine (colon). The colon is the part of the digestive system where waste material is stored. In patients with ulcerative colitis, ulcers and inflammation of the inner lining of the colon lead to symptoms of abdominal pain, diarrhea, and rectal bleeding.

Prof. M.U. Rabbani, Chairman of the Department of Medicine and a prominent cardiologist introduced and welcomed the guests. Dr. Hasan Haider, Department of Medicine also delivered a lecture.

ALIGARH :November 21

The Centre of West Asian Studies, Aligarh Muslim University is organizing a two-day interdisciplinary national seminar on ?The Arab Spring and Peace in West Asia? from November 22-23, 2011.

Prof. Mohammad Gulrez, Convener of the seminar said that the Arab world has witnessed a wave of rapid transformation that crossed the borders and set the region on an unpredictable path. What began as a local protest in the city of Sidi Bouzid in Tunisia after Mohammed Bouazizi set himself aflame in response to an insult directed at him by a local policewoman soon spread

throughout the country. This relatively minor event proved the spark of a popular revolution that put an end to the rule of one of the long-serving autocrats in the region within a matter of a few weeks. The euphoria that surrounded the humiliating flight of the Tunisian president bestowed a degree of confidence upon the Arab people across the region. Soon after, the Egyptians were able to topple Mubarak and his regime. Yemen, Libya, Bahrain and Syria followed the suit. Agitations of a revolutionary action skyrocketed in various countries and set the region on the threshold of a new era, marking a turning point in modern Arab history.

Prof. Gulrez said that the Conference provides the opportunity to ground the Arab uprising in contexts and expand the approaches of studying the region. This event will enable participants to collectively explore the repercussions of the events in West Asia and North Africa in the political and economic aspects, as well as on their implications for peace and stability in the region. The conference also seeks to explore the direct and indirect impact of those events on India in the various aspects.

He said that due to cultural and historical linkages between India and the Arab countries, as well the various shared political experiences, it becomes crucial to follow the developments and study their repercussions both inside and outside the region. The spread of the popular protests to countries upon which India relies for energy is very likely, given the internal realities of those countries both at the regimes and grassroots levels. Hence, the ongoing uprising touches directly on India's energy security, economy and even political sphere. Moreover, this popular uprising across the region has reasserted and enlivened West Asian Studies as a discipline in the Indian academy, and rendered it more relevantly than ever before. At the same time, it has also posed challenges to the field, rendering many of the common analytical tools obsolete and in need of comprehensive revision. These transformations are not reflected adequately either by the local scholarship or by the others. The conference seeks to collectively tackle the repercussions of the Arab uprising on the status of the field and the research and theoretical approaches governing it.

Khalid Saifullah of Parasitology Section, Department of Zoology, Aligarh Muslim University represented the University in a seminar on 'Control of Fasciolosis' (disease caused by tropical liver fluke) organized by the Department of Parasitology, Tamil Nadu Veterinary and Animal Sciences University (TANUVAS), Chennai.

Aligarh Muslim University is collaborating with Queen's University, Belfast, Aberystwyth University, Wales, UK and India's TANUVAS, Chennai in a consortium project on "Developing a 'validation portfolio' to exploit key virulence proteins in Fasciola species for parasite control" supported by Biotechnology and Biological Sciences Research Council, U.K.

Prof. Abbas Abidi also delivered an invited lecture on 'Immunodetection of Fasciola sp. using nano-structured porous silicon which generated considerable interest among the participating scientists both from India and abroad. On this occasion a monograph on snails and pamphlets in Tamil and English on the liver Fluke disease, prepared by the TANUVAS team, was also released.

Prof. Abidi said that field visits to Erode and Ooty were organized to interact with livestock farmers and field veterinarians and to apprise them of researches made in this field. Effort was made to educate them about the preventive measures and prospects of successful vaccine development. He said that tropical liver fluke is infective to cattle and buffaloes, and the human infection may be encountered in the endemic areas. An effective vaccine is the need of the hour because of emerging resistance in liver fluke against the available anthelmintics, Prof. Abidi added.Related Picture

ALIGARH: November 16

Prof. B.K. Das, Dean, Faculty of Mathematical Sciences and Head, Department of Mathematics, University of Delhi pointed out that mathematics has been used in every field of knowledge; this is why it is termed as the "mother of all technologies". Prof. Das was delivering inaugural address at the four-day training programme on "Non-Linear Analysis with Applications to Optimization and Game Theory" organized by the Department of Mathematics, Aligarh Muslim University.

ALIGARH : November 14

"Protection of minority rights is no longer viewed as a virtue but it is seen as a political necessity that strengthens modern plural society", this is what came through in a national seminar on "Minority Rights: Vision and Reality" organized by the Department of Political Science, Aligarh Muslim University today.

Inaugurating the national seminar, Justice M. S. A. Siddiqui, Chairman, National Commission for Minority Educational Institutions (NCMEI), Government of India said that the article 30 carters special rights to minorities and article 30 is absolute and it can be regulated by two counts. First it has to be reasonable and second the interest of minority must be kept in mind. Explaining Article 30, the Chairman, NCMEI said Indian Muslims have been given right to establish full right to establish and run their academic institutions. The Commission is committed to protect the minority rights duly granted by the Constitution of India. Using its adjudicatory powers, the Commission has declared Jamia Millia Islamia a minority institution. Justice Sifddiqui said the salvation of Muslims lies in modern education and they must adopt information technology.

Delivering the presidential address, AMU Vice Chancellor Prof. P. K. Abdul Azis said that education is the key to empowerment and Muslim enjoined by the Quran must rigorously pursue the education. He said that AMU has been striving to spread education relentlessly and setting of two new centres bears a testimony to its commitment to propagate

education among Muslims as it was also the cherished dream of Sir Syed Ahmad Khan. He said that no one can doubt the minority character of the Aligarh Muslim University as it fulfills all conditions of a minority institution.

Former Member of Parliament, Diplomat and presently President of All India Muslim Majlis-e-Mushawarat, New Delhi, Syed Shahabuddin said that Muslims should strengthen their relationship with the majority community and draw their attention towards their social, educational and political problems. He urged the government to ensure that the benefits of all minority schemes are made available to the minorities.

Speaking on the occasion, Prof. Faizan Mustafa, Vice Chancellor, National Law University Orissa, Cuttack, said that the democracy could only become fully functional if minorities are provided with special rights as the right do not symbolize appeasement but they are essential for the growth of pluralistic society. Tracing the minority rights all over the world, Prof. Faizan Mustafa said the Indian Constitution grants special rights to minorities for fulfilling their cultural aspirations. By safeguarding the cultural and linguistic aspirations, the minorities can be actively associated in the process of nation making. Prof. Mustafa referred to the gearing up of AMU minority case in Allahabad High Court and quoted several landmark judgments of the Supreme Court.

Maulana Fazlurrahim Mujaddadi, Rector, Jamiatul Hidaya made a PowerPoint presentation and regretted that minorities are not being benefited by the welfare schemes of the central government.

Dr. Aftab Alam, Convener of the seminar said that minorities do not enjoy rights but article 30 is the most violated article of the constitution and he made a strong point for its effective implementation. ALIGARH: November 13

Prof Jamal Ahmad, Director, Rajiv Gandhi Centre for Diabetes and Endocrinology, J.N. Medical College, Aligarh Muslim University said that diabetes in India has reached epidemic proportions and is increasing with Tsunamic speed. He was speaking on the World Diabetes Day that is celebrated on November 14 every year which is also an official United Nations Worlds Diabetes Day. Named to celebrate the birthday of Frederick Banting, who along with Charles Best, is credited with the discovery of Insulin. This day is marked with the global awareness campaign against Diabetes led by the International Diabetes Federation (IDF) that engages millions of people worldwide in diabetes advocacy and awareness.

Prof. Ahmad said that India at present has more than 62.2 million people with diabetes and 95% of this population is suffering from Type 2 diabetes. The increase in its prevalence is due to genetic predisposition, sedentary life style, increase in obesity, urbanization and change in lifestyle pattern. We must work hard to prevent the occurrence of metabolic syndrome/type 2 diabetes by preventing obesity (waist circumference 80 cm in females and 90 cm in males) accounting for its association with more than 60% of type 2 diabetes population. We must make all possible effort to reduce atleast 5-10% of weight. This is possible by walking 4-5 kms per day on all days and by eating carefully. The emphasis should be to consume food of low glycemic index values like mixed chapaties (wheat, barley and grams), beans, green leafy vegetables, curd, oats, salads and fruits with limited amount of apple, guava, orange etc. and to avoid food of high glycemic index values like potatoes, rice, bread, french fries, fast food etc. By brisk walking for half an hour per day and by careful eating and healthy habits (no smoking, no alcohol) and cutting down the intake of saturated fat, trans-fat (butter, dalda, animal fat etc) and salt intake, it is possible to reduce the prevalence of diabetes by 50 percent.

Prof. Ahmad said that it might also be noted that the incidence of Type 1 diabetes (5% of diabetes population) is also increasing. If a child complains of weakness, tiredness, weight loss otherwise eating well and having night bed-wetting or being hospitalized as a case of gastroenteritis, his blood sugar needs to be done. It is likely that he/she is suffering from Type 1 diabetes.

To save the life of such children, the above Centre with the help of Diabetes India Initiative/ pharmaceutical companies is providing free Insulin to all children especially the girl child up to the age of 21 years if they are reporting endocrine clinic of the hospital regularly. Attempts are also being made with the support of Diabetes India to provide free Insulin to everybody reporting for diabetes management to the Centre.

Prof. Ahmad further said that there is a tremendous increase in the complications associated with diabetes, especially in those who are not under optimal control. In India, diabetes is the single largest cause of legal blindness which can be prevented by taking care of A,B,C, of its management. A vast majority of patients undergoing renal dialysis and transplant have diabetes as the underline cause. Presently around 1% of the population has got diabetes renal disease per year besides more than 20 million populations already having diabetes renal disease. Most of these patients having diabetes renal disease do not enter End-Stage Renal Disease and die off cardiovascular complications. It is also being observed that 75% hospitalized patients of acute myocardial infarction either are known diabetic or undiagnosed. Further, associated with this disease there is a substantial increase in morbidity and mortality.

Diabetes is the single largest cause of Atraumatic amputation. A person with diabetes does not have to lose the lower limbs every 30 seconds if one takes simple steps like daily inspecting the feet, avoiding bare foot walking, looking for any cuts, cracks, dust accumulation and by use of proper foot-ware (neither loose nor tight). He should also report to his doctor in case he develops neuropathic symptoms (tingling, numbness, hypoesthesia's, hyperesthesia's, and decreased sensations in globe- and-stocking distributions) and peripheral vascular disease (cramping pain in the calf and thigh muscle especially at night and walking).

Prof. Ahmad appealed to all to join the campaign to prevent all diabetic complications and be careful to have optimal glycemic control, blood pressure & lipid control, to avoid smoking and alcohol and insisted careful eating and changing the lifestyle pattern. He requested all diabetic persons to simply remember A,B,C of diabetes management. "A" stands for A1c test that should be less than <6.5% (to be done every 3 months); "B" for Blood Pressure (should be <140/90 mmHg, <130/80 mmHg if urine is positive for albumin); "C" to keep LDL cholesterol < 100mg/dl, Triglycerides < 150 mg/dl and HDL-cholesterol >45mg/dl. In elderly and those associated with co-morbid conditions like heart disease, stroke, advanced retinopathy, the A1c should be <7%, besides cessation of smoking and alcohol and to continue lifestyle modification. Other prominent speakers include Mrs. Faouzia Khan, Minister of State for Minority Development, Govt. of Maharashtra, Mr. Syed Shahabuddin, former diplomat and Member of Parliament and President, All India Muslim Majlis-e-Mushawarat and Maulana Mohammad Fazlurrahim Mujaddadi, Rector, Jameatul Hidya, Jaipur and member of the high power committee to monitor the Govt.'s schemes related to minorities' development.

Dr. Aftab Alam said that despite constitutional safeguards, minorities in India have been discriminated against and their rights have been more than frequently violated and Muslim minority in particular suffers from development deficit as highlighted by the Sachar Committee report. There has been continued neglect both by the Central and State governments in the public policies to redress the development deficit of Muslim minority. Unfortunately, no other provision of the Constitution has perhaps been so much undermined as the Article 30 of the Indian Constitution, which was meant for ensuring educational development of the minorities. The complaints about the denial of permission/NOC establishing for minority educational institutions and refusal of recognition/affiliation have become very common, he added.

Dr. Aftab Alam said that the issues like secularism, religious conversion and freedom of religion, communal riots/pogrom and minorities' right to physical existence, the role of state and police during communal violence, role of National Commission for Minorities and National Commission for Minority Educational Institutions, empowerment of minorities and questions of reservation and educational and cultural rights of minorities are expected to be discussed during the technical sessions of the seminar.

Institute of Paramedical Sciences & Information Technology, Jammu Tawi and Al-Hafeez Educational Academy, Sahaswan, District Badaun and S.B.H. Azad Girls Degree College, Sambhal, Moradabad, UP.

Prof. Khan said that earlier the centre established five centres at Makhdoom Abdul Qasim Educational and Welfare Society, Saharsa, New Horizon School, Bhagalpur and Al-Aziz Educational Foundation Trust, Muzaffarpur in Bihar while the remaining two centres were established at Asim Siddiqui Memorial Degree College, Badaun and Madrasa Serajuyl Uloom, Sambhal, Moradabad in Uttar Pradesh. Now, the strength of centre has gone up to thirteen, Dr. Khan added.

Dr. Khan said that the approval has been given without any financial commitment on the part of the University and that these centres will function under the purview of the Centre for Distance Education. The Distance Education Centre will offer graduate and undergraduate courses at these Centres.

Prof. Azis also requested to handover the land within a shortest possible time preferably within one month so that the University can prepare a Detailed Project Report (DPR) and Detailed Feasibility Report (DFR) for submission to the Government of India and seek the permission of Hon?ble President of India in her capacity as the Visitor of the University as was done in the case of Murshidabad and Malappuram Centre.

In the notice, Mr. Kamthania said that the news of suspension of three officers alleged to have been issued by the MHRD was totally baseless and issued with ill intentions as the University has not received any such order.

The notice read that the 'noticee' has been making false and baseless allegations/imputations and gestures in public in the garb of the said alleged rumors only with an intent to defame the concerned officials and hurt their integrity therein causing great mental, social, spiritual and professional losses to them. It further observed that the illegal, irresponsible and unlawful acts on the part of the newspaper are creating hurdles to the University officials as it published the said news item by misrepresenting the true and correct facts and misusing the rights and privileges given to it by the law of the land.

Mr. Kamthania said that the newspaper has committed an offence of defamation and is liable to be prosecuted under section 500 of Indian Penal Code.

The Standing Counsel of AMU has asked the newspaper to clarify its position and publish an apology within a week or civil and criminals proceedings will be initiated against it and the University will also claim damage for the said illegal and malafide act against it before the competent court of law at its cost and risk.

Prof. Javed Akhtar, Dean, Faculty of Management Studies and Research, Prof. N.A.K. Durrani, Chairman, Department of Mass Communication, Prof. Sartaj Tabassum, Department of Chemistry, Prot. Qazi Mazhar Ali, Director, Computer Centre and Prof. Mohd. Gulrez, Dept. of West Asian Studies were appointed as its members. Prof. Akhtar Haseeb, OSD (Development) has been designated as the Coordinator who will also function as the institutional facilitator during the on-site visit of the Peer team.

ALIGARH, October 29: Dr. S Moied Ahmed, Associate Professor, Department of Anaesthesiology and Consultant In-Charge of Emergency and Critical Care Services, J. N. Medical College, Aligarh Muslim University, was recently invited to co-ordinate and conduct workshop on Management of Difficult Airway, at All India Institute of Medical Sciences, New Delhi. The workshop was a part of the 7th INDO-US Emergency Medicine Summit and 6th Annual Assembly of INDO-US Academic Council for Emergency and Trauma, organized jointly by All India Institute of Medical Sciences and University College of Medicine, New Delhi.

The workshop was attended by approximately 50 doctors of different specialties. The workshop comprised of lecture based discussions on the airway management of six case scenarios most commonly encountered in the Accident and Emergency department. The cases were illustrated with short video clippings on live patients so as to have a better understanding on the management of such patients. The airway management of patients with maxillofacial injury, cervical spine injury, head injury, cut throat injury, poly trauma with co-morbidity and acute burn injury were discussed in detail. This was followed by hands-on training on manikins with various basic and advanced airway adjuncts. The workshop was structured and formatted by Dr. Moied which was highly appreciated by the organizers and the attendees because of its relevance in patient management in emergency department.

Dr. Moied also delivered a lecture on ?The Challenges of Airway Management in Emergency Department? and participated in

the clinico-pathological case presentation along with postgraduate resident doctor, Dr Shivani Agarwal. His video based deliberation dealt with all the critical issues in managing airway in accident and emergency department. He enumerated the challenges and highlighted the precautions and techniques one should adopt while managing airways in A & E.

On this occasion he was also invited to submit a research project under the banner of Indian Network of Critical Illness and Injury Translational Trail Experts (INCIITTE), which is funded by CSIR/DBT/ICMR. The project was discussed in detail to assess the feasibility of converting it into a multicentre trial involving prestigious medical colleges in the country. Prof Shahjahan Bano, Chairman, Department of Anaesthesiology and his colleagues have congratulated him for his performance.

ALIGARH :October 28

Amidst great excitement and hope the AMU high-power team led by Vice Chancellor, Prof. P. K. Abdul Azis received a tumultuous welcome at both Aurangabad and Malegaon cities of Maharashtra, which have offered land for establishing AMU Centre.

On the firm commitment from Maharashtra state and on the basis of invitation extended to AMU Vice Chancellor by Mrs. Fauzia Khan, Minister of State for Primary Education and Awkaf, the AMU team visited Aurangabad and Malegaon and inspected each site in both the cities identified by the State administration.

Accompanied by Minister of State, Mrs. Fauzia Khan, Principal Secretary of Minority Development Department Mrs. Thekkekara and Secretary of State Minority Commission, Mr. Syed Hashmi, Prof. P. K. Abdul Azis along with his team inspected the site situated near Aurangabad and then proceeded to Khuldabad town located 30 kilometers away from Aurangabad in Soli Bhanjan. The Khuldabad site, a contiguous plot of 332 acres, is a historically significant and spiritually important location. Besides the tomb of Mughal Emperor Aurangzeb, many important sufi saints are buried in the region.

The idea of AMU Centre in Maharashtra has ignited the aspirations of the people. Hundreds of prominent citizens eagerly awaited to attend the interaction with the visiting AMU team. The programme, organized at the Maulana Azad Research Centre, Aurangabad by Maharashtra Federation of Minority Education Organizations, was represented by over 500 Muslim managed

educational institutions of Maharashtra. The large and enthusiastic gathering mainly comprising educationists and social activists urged the high-power AMU team to set up the AMU Centre in the region so that the minorities and other extremely backward social segments get an opportunity of best possible education.

Addressing the gathering, the AMU Vice Chancellor, Prof. P. K. Abdul Azis said that the University is carrying forward the vision and mission of its founder, Sir Syed Ahmad Khan by creating educational opportunities and nurturing an institutional set up across the nation by establishing AMU Centres. The sole objective is to bring into modern education fold, the most excluded social class and to cultivate secular values, rational approach, scientific temperament and also help capacity building among the common people so that they can meaningfully become partner in the process of nation building.

Prof. Azis shed light on the golden history of the University and its contribution to the nation. He also focused on the genesis and the background of the establishment of five AMU centres across the nation including in Maharashtra. He threw light on the alarming development deficit; particularly the pathetic educational scenario prevailing in minority concentrated 91 districts. The vision and mission of Sir Syed Ahmad Khan and the mandate which has been given to AMU for educational and cultural advancement of Muslims of India in the direction of furthering the cause of promoting education. Through a PowerPoint presentation interspersed with explanations, Prof. Azis drew attention to the statutory positions available in the AMU Act, 1920 amended until 1981.

He clarified that the process of establishing AMU Centre in Maharashtra will commence with the transfer of 250-300 acres of contiguous land free of cost and without any encumbrances. The University will then seek the necessary approval of the Visitor and grants from the central government. The University will appoint a consultant for preparing a Detailed Feasibility Report and Detailed Project Report simultaneously for the consideration of the government and necessary amendments in the statutes and ordinances will be made. Once the University receives the approval and the grant, it would put the whole process on fast track and launch its academic programme in phased manner and develop the infrastructure in well-defined stages to hopefully make the centre fully functional in 12-15 years? time.

He made it clear that both the AMU and the State government should urge the Central government to provide funds. The classes will commence only after getting Visitor?s approval and budget from the Central government.

Prof. Azis emphasized that encroachments and settlements, if any, on the proposed land should be removed before handing it over to AMU and a 35 feet wide road be provided from nearby national/state highway to AMU Centre. He said that an independent electricity line and establishment of 33 KV/11 KV Sub Station of at least 20 mega watt dedicated supply should also be provided at the cost of Maharashtra government. The state government should also provide water supply for construction and domestic use and establish

water treatment plant, internet facility, sewage treatment plant and other essential facilities, he added.

The Maharashtra Minister of State for Primary Education and Awkaf, Mrs. Fauzia Khan, who has played an important role in identifying the required land for AMU Centre at Aurangabad, said that the Aurangabad district deserves most for establishing AMU Centre as it would benefit Muslim students of eight districts situated in Marathwada region.

While interacting with educationists and prominent citizens, Prof. N. A. K. Durrani, one of the AMU team members emphasized that the people of the region should extend full support in unison for the AMU initiative. The Centre is more important than the issue of its location as it would certainly benefit the whole region. The focus should be on establishing the centre in any of the two cities where the lands have been identified.

The other members of the team Prof. Anwar Jahan Zuberi, Dean, Faculty of Social Sciences and former Vice Chancellor, University of Calicut, Prof. Jawaid Akhtar, Dean, Faculty of Management Studies and Research, Prof. Ekram Husain, Principal, Zakir Husain College of Engineering and Technology and Prof. M. Saud Alam Qasmi, Former Dean, Faculty of Theology also interacted with the people assembled at both the cities.

In a similar fashion the visiting team received a warm welcome in Malegaon where a large number of people gathered to welcome the team before inspecting the identified two site. Dozens of memoranda were handed over to the AMU Vice Chancellor pleading for establishing AMU Centre in Malegaon. The team visited the site located at Rampura, 30 kilometers from Malegaon where local Shiv Sena and BJP activists protested and blocked the site inspection. The team inspected the land from a distance. Later the District Collector P. Velrasu and Mr. Bhujbal along with the local MLA met AMU Vice Chancellor and explained that the issue of protest is a small issue that could be easily tackled by convincing the local people of the area.

The AMU team also interacted with the citizens representing educational and social organizations and also the district officials including the District Collector of Nashik, P. Velrasu.

The team also inspected the second site situated 24 km away from the Malegaon city and 14 kilometers away from the Manmad railway junction. The Nashik District Collector Mr. P. Velrasu informed the AMU team that the land belonged to Social Forestry Department and if selected, it would have to get mutation which might take a minimum of six months? time.

The Aligarh Muslim University Proctor, Prof. Mujahid Beg today condemned the ill efforts of a section of people to defame him leveling malicious charges against him. He alleged that some teachers and one-two employees are using students for the sake of their own personal interest. He said that the unholy attempt of his character assassination is being made by ill designs which would not succeed.

Prof. Beg said that Prof. Saleem Akhtar has been appointed as Chief Election Officer by the Vice Chancellor to conduct the elections of AMU Students? Union and he has already declared the date and schedule of the elections. Prof. Beg said that on the demands of senior students of the University it was decided by the Chief Election Officer at the Union Hall to postpone the election for the time being. The next date and schedule of the AMUSU elections will be notified by the Chief Election Officer.

Prof. Beg observed that some youths sitting on dharna in front of the VC lodge are destabilizing the peaceful atmosphere and the law and order of the campus. Their motive is not get the Students? Union but they are working on some hidden agenda of vested interests in the University. He further said that due to 4-6 students, career and the future of 32000 students will not be allowed to put on stake. The Proctor has appealed to all the students that they should not become a tool in the hands of any teacher or employee, instead have faith on Allah and should strive to make their future bright.

Prof. Beg categorically said that no one will be allowed to play games with law and order in the campus. He said that I am fully aware that some outsiders and anti-social elements are trying to breach peaceful atmosphere of the campus unsuccessfully, for which action will be taken against them with the cooperation of the district and police administration.

Advising some of the teachers, Prof. Beg urged that they should not take help of the criminal and outsider elements to achieve their own goals as it is damaging the academic ambience of the campus and prestige of AMU, a century old institution of higher learning at par excellence. Prof. Beg said that a great institution like AMU has a unique distinction and a Vice Chancellor is for the institution and the institution is not for the Vice Chancellor. He urged that we all must make positive attempts to save this great seat of learning as we all are its inseparable parts.

Prof. Beg condemned the people in strongest terms who are involved in such a dirty politics. He said that the almighty Allah and the soul of Sir Syed would not forgive such elements. He said that all the associations and organizations should work for the interest of the

teachers, students, employees and the institution and must come forward to strengthen the University administration in maintaining the peace and law and order of the University. ALIGARH: October 25

Professor Rais Akhtar, Visiting Professor, Department of Geology, Aligarh Muslim University was invited as the Guest of Honour at the National Seminar on "Himalayan Resources: Issues, Challenges and Management Strategies", organized by the University of Kashmir, Department of Geography and Regional Development, Srinagar (J & K).

In his keynote address, Prof. Akhtar emphasized on the economic changes and population pressure threatening ecological scenario of Himalayan region leading to environmental degradation. The rural poor, often found in mountain areas in a vast number of 718 million worldwide, meet their livelihood needs through cropping or livestock. These challenges also include physical isolation and attendant risks, limited access to markets and inputs, and production cost due to difficult topography, low soil fertility, harsh environments and natural hazards.

Prof. Akhtar observed that the climate change is expected to exacerbate threats to biodiversity resulting from land use cover change and population pressure. Increased risk of extinction of several flora and fauna species is likely as a result of the synergistic effects of climate change and habitat fragmentation. Threats to the ecological stability of wetlands would also increase the frequency and extent of forest fires in mountain areas.

Increase in endemic morbidity and mortality due to diarrheal disease primarily associated with floods and droughts are expected due to projected changes in the hydrological cycle associated with global warming. Researches carried out at the malarial research centre suggest that warming will increase altitudinal rise in malaria transmission in the North-East (Mizoram, Arunachal Pradesh) and Himachal Pradesh. Exploitation of natural resources associates with rapid urbanization and economic development in most parts of Himalayas has led to increase in air and water pollution, land degradation and other environmental problems that have placed enormous pressure on urban infrastructure, human wellbeing, cultural integrity and socioeconomic settings, Prof. Akhtar concluded.

ALIGARH: October 25

The Training Programme for AMU School Teachers of Arabic and Theology organized by the UGC Academic Staff College, Aligarh Muslim University in collaboration with the MESCO, Hyderabad concluded today. The ten-day training programme, which commenced on October 16, comprised of interactive sessions on the teaching of Quran according to the norms and science of the Quran

recitation, Arabic grammar and Arabic language. The course was organized at the behest of the AMU Vice Chancellor, Professor P. K. Abdul Azis for the professional development of school teachers of Aligarh Muslim University.

Hon?ble Supreme Court for providing access either by inspecting of or by permitting certified copies of the evaluated answer books and also to frame the operational guidelines as per the provision of RTI Act

The University allows re-evaluation of answer books within ten days of the declaration of the results. The period is extendable by another ten days for genuine cases. The University also decided to weeding out of the evaluated answer book after six month from the date of declaration of the results.

The proposal to switch over to two-tier Admission Tests i.e., Preliminary Admission Test and Final Admission Test in MBBS/BDS/B.Tech./B.Arch. and class XI/Diploma Engineering Courses from 2012-13 session was also approved in principal. The Academic Council has constituted a Committee under the Chairmanship of Prof. Saleemuddin with all the Deans of the Faculties and Controller of Exams as its members. This Committee of senior faculty members of the University would work out the modalities and identify the challenges. ALIGARH: October 22

In response to the accusation of committing misconduct under the AMU Act 1920, violating the Statutes and ordinances appearing in a section of the press, AMU Vice Chancellor Prof. P. K. Abdul Azis reiterated that he has strictly followed the rule book as per the Aligarh Muslim University (Amendment) Act 1981 and that not a single decision was taken by him that was not in consonance with existing provisions in the amended AMU Act or in vogue as a time honoured practice in AMU.

Prof. Azis categorically pointed out that the President of India, who is the Visitor of the University is empowered in the AMU Act to annul any decision taken by the University if it is violating the AMU Act, Statutes and Ordinances.

Since no decision taken in the University during his four and half years? regime has ever been annulled by the Visitor, it bears a testimony to the fact that no violation of the AMU Act has taken place. Any accusation in this regard is baseless and deserves condemnation, he added.

ALIGARH :October 21

The CBI probe into the allegations against the Vice Chancellor of Aligarh Muslim University (AMU) will soon culminate into a decisive phase. The AMU Vice Chancellor, Prof. P. K. Abdul Azis was in CBI Delhi office yesterday to provide clarifications raised in a questionnaire prepared by the CBI on the basis of the matters raised in the files transmitted to it by the Ministry of Human Resource Development (MHRD) and the University.

The Vice Chancellor has presented the University position with respect to all the points raised and defended the actions taken explaining in detail the rules and practices prevalent in the University.

The interaction was useful as it provided an opportunity to

draw attention to the legitimate provisions, conventions, traditions and the legal framework under which the action and decisions were taken with regard to some of the contentious issues relating to the payment of TA and DA, HTA, Income Tax of Prof. Azis totaling a sum of Rs. 1.8 Lakh.

On the issue of alleged financial irregularities, AMU Vice Chancellor, Prof. P. K. Abdul Azis emphasized the point that the University managed its funds perfectly within the standard financial management practices in vogue as per government rules. He also clarified that the University has received no major audit paras during the last three years in its audit reports and the charges of financial irregularities are baseless.

He further said that the University has given its replies to the audit paras raised in the special audit report conducted in 2010 and is ready to comply with any directives issued in this regard by C & A.G.

Prof. Azis said that no moment has saddened him more in the last four years than today?s event when the birth anniversary of Sir Syed is being celebrated with great enthusiasm throughout the world, it is opposed in the University. The gate of his residence has been blocked to restrict him from participating in the commemorative meeting and he was compelled to get out of his residence from backdoor. A bunch of self-seekers is determined to cause incalculable loss to the University and this is highly regrettable, he added.

Vice Chancellor, Prof. P. K. Abdul Azis thanked the students, faculty members and the general public who gathered in thousands at the Athletics Ground to participate in the Sir Syed Day commemorative function waiting patiently with extreme discipline for more than three hours.

He expressed his unhappiness and condemned the obstacles created by a group of teachers and suspended students by blocking the roads and the Vice Chancellor?s lodge forcefully. He however said that the public meeting is a reflection of respect and regard the University has for its founder.

AMU Vice Chancellor expressed unhappiness on the non-cooperative attitude of the district police administration towards the Proctor's team despite several request made for crowd management and traffic control for the smooth passage of Mr. Salman Khursheed to attend the function as chief guest. He said that showing black flags or 'Not Welcome' banners to the chief guest is against the great traditions of AMU. The University considers Mr. Salman Khursheed as the 'Most Welcome' guest and honours his association with it as his birthplace, which would remain an important emotional bookmark in the story of Mr. Salman Khursheed's life.

The Vice Chancellor appealed to AMU community to forget minor differences and work for the development of the University and the community.

In his welcome address, Prof. V. K. Abdul Jaleel, Registrar said that AMU is celebrating the 194th birth anniversary of Sir Syed Ahmad Khan, the founder of this historic institution and the torch bearer of Aligarh Movement. He was not only the first Renaissance Indian Muslim of the 19th century, but was also the architect of modern India.

He said that Sir Syed explored the possibility of modernity for the Muslims and cultivated a modern approach towards ever changing social realities. His vision and mission is highly relevant today in the Indian context.

Prof. Qazi Afzal Husain, Dean, Faculty of Arts made it clear that Sir Syed movement was certainly more than a reformative campaign as Sir Syed propounded a new world view that would eventually empower the Muslims. For him education was the bedrock of ultimate progress. "No reformist of 19th and 20th century could vie with him as he was not mere a founder of an educational institution but was instrumental in shaping the future of new generations. He urged students to live up to the demands of the contemporary world and only then they could be described as the true heir of Sir Syed's legacy.

Prof. Ali Mohammad Naqvi, Dean, Faculty of Theology highlighted the awe-inspiring attributes of Sir Syed's personality and said scientific approach, deep rooted human concern, freedom of expression and concern for national duties summed up his personality.

"If the greywater can be managed in an environmentally responsible manner in accordance with ecologically sustainable development principles and protection of public health and the health of the household, it would become a water resource of significant value", said Dr. Jawed Alam, Associate Professor at the Department of Civil Engineering, Z. H. College of Engineering & Technology, Aligarh Muslim University while presenting the paper on "Grey water Use to Augment water Sustainability in India", at the International Conference held at National Institute of Technology, Calicut (Kerela).

Dr. Alam said that wastewater generated from bathroom, laundry and kitchen is generally known as grey water. Greywater represents about 68% of the total wastewater. When kitchen wastewater is excluded, the percentage of greywater becomes about 61%. He further said that the study concluded that the greywater reuse for toilet flushing can alone reduce fresh water demand by 10-25%. The use of grey water in India is in the stage of infancy. Though, various developed countries are already utilizing this new water potential after some preliminary treatments depending on the type of use. In India the greywater system may be very effective in the school/college campuses especially those with residential facilities.

Dr. Alam emphasized that This imbalance has brought a crisis with regard to water in many regions of the world. It is projected that by 2025, about 3.5 billion people will live in water-stressed countries. There are at least 1.1 billion people without access to a safe water supply and about 2.5 billion without adequate sanitation systems and the majority of them live in developing countries. India occupies only 3.29 million km2 geographical area, which form 2.4% of the worlds land area, it supports over 15% of world's population with only 4% of the world's water resources.

ALIGARH: October 13

The Vice Chancellor of Aligarh Muslim University, Prof. P. K. Abdul Azis reiterated the stand of the University that AMU is committed to establish its Centre in Kishanganj, Bihar only if a contiguous piece of 250-300 acres of land, free from all encumbrances is handed over to the University.

Addressing a press conference, Prof. Azis explained that the decision taken by the University functionaries to establish a Centre of AMU is a firm commitment made to the people of Bihar and very specially to the people of Kishanganj District and nearby areas.

Reacting to the allegations leveled by the Bihar Government, AMU Vice Chancellor said that the Secretary, Department of Human Resource Development, Bihar Government informed the University that the Government of Bihar has allocated 243.76 acres of land on payment of Rs. Ten as a token salami and Re. One as annual rent for 30 years lease with the option of renewal. This official communication of Bihar Government did not indicate that the land offered to AMU was in three pieces. The University, however, expressed its willingness to take over the land if an area of 250-300 acres of land, contiguous to plot number one and inclusive of it, with direct access to the State Highway is allocated.

AMU Vice Chancellor, Prof. Azis felt that despite the Chief Minister expressed desire, of the Bihar bureaucracy never responded 'promptly to University's request regarding AMU Centre in Kishanganj'.

Prof. Azis urged the Bihar Chief Minister to identify the contiguous piece of land and the land should be transferred to AMU without any type of lease.

Prof. Azis also denied the allegations of the Bihar Government and stated that the land provided to AMU in both the places are contiguous. The West Bengal had handed over a single plot of 299.64 acres divided by the Farakka Canal but will be in one piece and the Government of Kerala had handed over a plot of 335.99 acres of land free of cost for AMU Centres. If the Government of

Bihar was fast enough to respond promptly to our request, AMU would also have been able to start its Kishanganj Centre along with Murshidabad and Malappuram.

He urged the Bihar Chief Minister, Mr. Nitish Kumar to hand over 250-300 acres of land so that AMU can proceed further on the matter. The procedure to get the approval of the Visitor under Section 12 (C) of the AMU Act would be initiated only after getting the land in the name of AMU, as was done in the case of Murshidabad and Malappuram. **Related Picture** 1. Prof. Anwar Jahan Zuberi, Dean, Faculty of Social Sciences said that she has witnessed remarkable progress in the development of infrastructure in the University during the tenure of Prof. P. K. Abdul Azis. Since the establishment of Faculty of Arts building way back in 1960, no concrete efforts were made to extend the classrooms, labs and other academic facilities and within a short span of four years a new building for Social Sciences was provided besides the additional provision of a new building for Library and Information Science and Mass Communication to be constructed at a cost of nearly Rs. 6 crores. The Social Science faculty is now in a resurgent mode as the Departments of West Asian Studies, Economics and Sociology were able to attract substantial special grants for academic and research projects in this academic session.

Prof. Azis laid the foundation stone of a hostel for differently abled students to meet the residential needs of the students of Ahmadi School for Visually Challenged at the Ahmadi School for Visually Challenged complex. The University has sanctioned an amount of Rs. Six Crores and the work has been assigned to CPWD for the construction of an all inclusive hostel including kitchen, dining hall, provost room, general toilets, stairs and ramp for 90 boys and girls.

AMU Vice Chancellor also laid the foundation stone of Central Building Block of Z. H. College of Engineering and Technology with a cost of Rs. Four Crores. The construction of the building in the first stage comprises one Lecture Theatre and three Digital Classrooms with utilities. The construction will be completed by August 11, 2012.

The Vice Chancellor also laid the foundation stone for Girls' Hall of residence for 1000 students besides Law Faculty on Qila Road initially for 105 students. The Four storey building will be completed on January 21, 2013 by the CPWD.

Addressing the foundation stone laying ceremony, Prof. Azis said that the University needs 5-6 more Halls to accommodate the boys and girls. He said that the University authorities have provided 2,500 additional seats in the hostels during the last four years.

While laying the foundation stone for disabled hostel, Prof. Azis said that the hostel for boys and girls will be restricted only for the students of Ahmadi School for Visually Challenged. He said that the University administration was trying to develop a new living environment in this school with holistic planning.

Prof. Saud Alam Qasmi, Guest of Honor and former Dean of the Faculty of Theology said that knowledge is the key to life, as it provides empowerment to the community. He highlighted the teachings of Quran that are the directives towards attainment of knowledge.

He said that knowledge is a two sided sword, it can protect humanity as well as cause destruction to it. The complete knowledge is that which gives an insight of both the deen and the duniya. Prof. Qasmi said that Madarsas are not only creating awareness among the masses but also acting as an instrument of cleansing the society by producing God fearing people.

Dr. Fatima Shujatullah, Director, Centre for Promotion of Science said that the intellectual activity of the Muslim community had become confined to the literature, religious studies and few subjects in social sciences, and that an inclination towards scientific pursuit was lacking prompted the Centre for Promotion of Science to take step to promote science education among the Muslim community of India. She said that a vast majority of Muslim students acquire their primary education in either madarsas or Muslim managed schools. This Centre is pursuing different programs for the enrichment and uplift of teachers of Deeni Madaris and Muslim minority educational institutions.

Dr. Shakeel Samdani, Coordinator, General Education Centre while conducting the programme threw light on the yeomen services the AMU has rendered in spreading the light of modern knowledge amidst a large ocean of traditional stream of education. ALIGARH: October 08

Dengue is the most rapidly spreading mosquito-borne viral disease in the world. Other haemorhagic fevers like Crimean Congo haemorrhagic fever, chikungunya and Hantaan virus are slowly but surely making inroads into India, said Prof. P.K. Abdul Azis while addressing the National symposium on "Emerging trends in Dengue and other haemorrhagic fevers in India" organized by the Department of Microbiology, J.N. medical College, Aligarh Muslim University.

Prof. Azis said that in the last 50 years, incidence of Dengue has increased many fold with increasing geographic expansion to new countries and, in the present decade, from urban to rural settings. An estimated fifty-million dengue infections occur annually, worldwide and approximately 2.5 billion people live in dengue endemic countries. He said that Aligarh too experienced a severe outbreak from July - October 2010 during which 268 cases were reported. He observed that effective control of Dengue needs active participation of the civil society and the administration.

Mr. Manish Chauhan, District Magistrate, Aligarh said that to control the dengue and haemorhagic fevers we should start the mass mobilization like the Polio Eradication Programme. He said that for the community based approach we should take the help of print media and other means of communication. Mr. Chauhan felt that in the prevention of Dengue, the role of NGOs cannot be undermined.

Prof. Abida Malik, Convener of this National Symposium said that the problem is the increase in the number of hemorrhagic fever cases due to the re-emergence of complicated Malaria, Dengue, Chikungunya, CCHF and other viral fevers. Prof. Abida said that Misdiagnosis and under reporting are major obstacles in understanding the full burden of these diseases. This is a cause of concern to the health care providers not only in Aligarh but in the rest of India as well. She said that in 2010 more than 300 cases of dengue were detected, while this year till date 30 cases have been reported in J.N. Medical College & Hospital.

She told that at Aligarh in an ongoing study at our centre, out of the 70 suspected cases, 17.9% were found positive for

Chikungunya till date. Keeping these rapidly emerging diseases in mind the Department of Microbiology decided to bring together the eminent faculty from various fields under one roof to share their views and enlighten the delegates with their experiences.

Prof. M. Ashraf Malik, Principal and CMS, J.N. Medical College said that during March till Dec 2010 this hospital provided 2428 units of platelets to patients of hemorrhagic fevers, out of them only 277 cases were from this hospital, only 7 of them being from paediatrics age group. He said that this year, in 2011 we have provided 1037 units of platelets out of which 462 (45%) in September alone. These figures probably show the magnitude of the problem in this part of the country.

Prof. M.H. Beg, Dean, Faculty of Medicine said that Dengue has taken high toll of deaths. He said that 200 years back, the first case of Dengue was discovered and since then this problem is continued to be rising. Prof. Beg said that according to WHO report 2.5 billion people were affected from the Dengue all over the world and 1.8 billion people were suffering only in developing countries.

Dr. Meher Rizvi, Organizing Secretary of the Symposium said that the dramatic increase in dengue cases in recent years and the worrying emergence of other hemorrhagic fevers in India particularly Crimean Congo hemorrhagic fever, Chikungunya, West Nile fever, hantaan virus, not to mention leptospira, & the protean manifestations of Malaria has necessitated this symposium. She said that a concerted effort towards acquiring more in depth, holistic, all encompassing knowledge of these emerging diseases is the need of the hour. Dr. Meher urged the administration and community to lay a proactive role in mosquito control with a sense of heightened urgency.

Prof. Haris M. Khan, Organizing Chairman of the Symposium proposed the vote of thanks and Dr. Fatima Khan conducted the programme $\bf Related\ Picture$

He is survived by a son and daughter. Dr. Zaidi joined the Aligarh Muslim University as Research Assistant in Maulana Azad Library in 1966-67 and was appointed as lecturer in the Department of Hindi on October 7, 1969.

Prof. Zaidi Jafar Raza authored more than one dozen books in Hindi, Urdu and English. He also served as Coordinator, General Education Centre, Secretary, University Games Committee, Member-in-Charge, Public Relations and University Press and Head, Department of Hindi of the Aligarh Muslim University.

ALIGARH :October 06

In view of certain factually incorrect and biased news reports in a section of national media regarding the facilities available for female undergraduate students at the Women' College Library, the Aligarh Muslim University Women's College administration has vehemently condemned any such misleading reporting that is aimed at tarnishing the image of this great and age old historic seat of female learning.

Prof. (Mrs.) Bilquis Nasim Waris, Principal, Women's College has clarified that the Library has very good collection of reference books, which includes Encyclopedias, Dictionaries, Atlases, Maps, yearbooks etc. There are around 40 Encyclopedias in the Library including Encyclopedia Britannica, Callier's Encyclopedia, Chamber's Encyclopedia, Lexicon Universal Encyclopedia etc. The Library collection presently covers more than 32 subjects including Literature (English, Hindi, Urdu, Persian, Arabic and Sanskrit).

Prof. Waris said that Women's College Library was established almost 70 years back in the main Women's College building and was later shifted in the new Library building in 1980. The Library is meant for undergraduate (B.A./B.Sc./B.Com.) students and also for M.Sc. Home Science and Ph.D. Home Science students. Presently this Library has 52,441 books, out of which 1959 fall under donated category. The Library houses 33478 books in English, 13153 in Urdu and 5810 books in Hindi.

There are two issue sections in the College Library for

students and teaching and non-teaching staff of the college. One is an open access section especially for students. It has three reading rooms including one reserved for journals, newspapers, previous years' question papers and magazines including Journals for Post-graduate Home Science students.

The other reading rooms have good collection of textbooks, journals and subject dictionaries, competitive books. The students can consult these books and they can also get these books issued for photocopying, anytime during the Library's working hours. The Xerox machine is also available adjacent to the Library building. Around 60 students are always seen using the facility in the morning hours on a daily basis.

Prof. Waris said that keeping with the changing times and to make best use of modern technology for easy reference, the Library has recently undertaken the Computerization of data in MS-Excel format. Three computers have been installed for the use of students in third reading room, where general books are also present. The library catalogue has been fully digitalized and a list of all the books is now available on computer for easy reference for the students. The seating and workspace arrangement at the Women's college library has been refurbished fifty chairs and ten tables to provide additional seating space in the third reading room. The College has also purchased ten additional Almirahs for arrangement of new books in a proper way.

The Women's College Library is run under the able management of a highly qualified librarian and support staff (B. Lib. and M. Lib.) who are very helpful and cooperating to the students.

Prof. Waris said that in the recent past, certain additional steps have been taken by the College administration to improve the facilities and address issues raised by students to extend these facilities. For instance, 465 books were purchased during 2008-2009 and 313 books during 2009-2010. Another 300 books were donated during 2008-2010. Besides this, the Women's college library has opened a separate section for books on career planning. The new section contains 874 books on various topics.

For the smooth administration of the library and extending facilities to the students, the College Library Committee has submitted a proposal to the University administration for facilitating the library with certain essential services including ten computers with internet facility, one photocopier machine, ten books racks, ten almirahs for reading room, four A.C. and five desert coolers for reading rooms, one Wager cooler for reading room, complete Networking with Central library, supply of books from Maulana Azad Library on loan/demand basis and availability of computerized catalogue. A list of latest books for all subjects, prepared by the concerned teachers of the College has been approved by the Vice Chancellor and it is expected that in the current academic year the library will get more books and other facilities from the University.

an additional reading room facility (to accommodate up to 50 students) has been provided for in the library to make available more space for in-library reading and studies with effect from May 2011 in addition to the already existing two large reading rooms at Women's

college library.

Prof. Bilquis Nasim Waris said that the College administration has held meetings with the undergraduate students of the College pursuant to the recent news reports and the students have expressed complete satisfaction on the library and reading room arrangements. She urged the alumni of the Women's College and the University to come up with concrete proposals for the development of the College infrastructure instead of criticizing the University administration for non-issues.

To preempt any new move to target the AMU Vice Chancellor once again on trivial and routine issue the AMU Finance Officer has clarified that at the instance of AMU, the Kerala University has now fixed the retirement details including pension benefits of the AMU Vice Chancellor, Prof. P. K Abdul Azis formerly Professor of Kerala University.

The Kerala University has finally responded to our initiative and fixed the pension of Prof. Azis as communicated vide letter No. Accounts VI (B)/2011 dated September 29, 2011. As per the information by the University of Kerala the pension of Prof. Azis was sanctioned on 01.03.2011 and an arrear of Rs. 3,28,750 was paid along with the seven month pension amount paid to him till October 2011.

The Finance Officer has informed that AMU Vice Chancellor, Prof. P. K. Abdul Azis has remitted all the pension amount received by him from the University of Kerala into the AMU account / fund soon after receiving the amount. In accordance with the standard rules, the University has now fixed his salary minus the pension w.e.f. November 2011

AMU Vice Chancellor, Prof. P. K. Abdul Azis has clarified that his date of birth is widely available on the web and in public domain for the past three years on the official website of the University www.amu.ac.in.

It is indeed intriguing that a stale RTI information of 2010 was once again recycled to keep the flames of the denigration campaign alive against the venerable office of the AMU Vice Chancellor.

"The intention of raising the issue of my date of birth becomes even murkier as Mr. Waseem Ahmad, former Rajya Sabha member and the then Member of AMU's Executive Council, himself obtained my detailed resume in 2007 for placing the same in the VC panel". My biodata including the date of birth was placed before the Executive Council and subsequently in the University Court. The whole AMU fraternity is aware of this fact, he pointed out.

Prof. Azis further said that it is a well-known fact and Mr. Waseem knows it the best that AMU Visitor (Hon'ble President of India) is the appointing authority of AMU Vice Chancellor and his personal file is in MHRD and instead of seeking the required

information from the Visitor's / MHRD office, he has deliberately knocked on the wrong doors as part of the larger design. It is a testimony of his deep frustration that despite his massive efforts, that misled both MHRD and the Hon?ble Visitor in setting up a slew of probes, nothing incriminating was found either against the Vice Chancellor or the University. He appears to be the 'Guardian Angel' of AMU in MHRD circle. "When I denied to Mr. Waseem the illegitimate largesse he was enjoying in AMU such as free guest house stay and meals, local transportation in official vehicles, quota in admissions, appointments and contracts, his hostile faculties suddenly woke up and assumed the present dimensions", he elaborated.

Deploring the rising trend of distortion of facts in a section of the Press, he pointed out that when contacted, the AMU PRO, Dr. Rahat Abrar had told the correspondent of a national newspaper that the information on the date of birth is available on the website. The University is unable to understand why the correspondent had put out a blatantly one-sided story to sully the image of the AMU Vice Chancellor. It is further intriguing that the said correspondent had solely relied on the utterly biased opinion provided by one Dr. Tariq Islam, a Reader in the Department of Philosophy, whose role as an RTI activist is found to be a ploy to cover up his own very doubted academic credentials. He keeps attacking the authorities to save himself from any action, the Vice Chancellor observed.

Prof. Azis further explained that the Aligarh Muslim University does have a foolproof and well-established system in place to determine the crucial date of retirement of its Vice Chancellor and other concomitant considerations and all concerned including the MHRD are aware of the date when the present Vice Chancellor would demit office. The University has initiated the task with utmost transparency and responsibility, dubious and malicious interventions ultimately tarnish the glorious image of the AMU and its chief academic and executive officer.

The Group Editor of Rashtriya Sahara, Aziz Burney has questioned credibility of Anna Hazare. He said that corruption is not only financial but it also has a communal and fascistic implication. He questioned why Anna Hazare remained silent on communalism of Modi, Mr. Burney was addressing the Symposium on Democracy and Jan Lok Pal Bill organized by the General education Centre of Aligarh Muslim University.

Burney pointed out that our constitution has provisions to deal with corruption effectively. In our democracy, Parliament has a right to enact the laws and there is a well defined system for that. That system should not be encroached upon by anyone. He said that the real motive behind all this movement is something else and the corruption issue is only an excuse. Burney said that the proposed Jan Lok Pal Bill is bent towards a particular ideology and the bill should not be allowed to be passed until the Muslim community is given adequate representation in Civil Society proportionate to their population.

Presiding over the Symposium, AMU Vice Chancellor, Prof.

P.K. Abdul Azis said that the nation is presently reeling with corrupt practices in every walk of life and causing almost all the cases of human right violation. Prof. Azis appealed to the students to follow the path shown by Islam and teachings of Sir Syed and develop strong moral strength. He said that usually when a person works honestly, he faces hurdles also.

Delivering the keynote address, former Advocate General S.M.A. Kazmi said that judging a person by only one movement and calling him a Gandhi or Mahatma is too early. He said that Gandhi became Mahatma Gandhi after a prolonged non-violent movement whereas some people have equated Anna Hazare with Gandhi only to justify their movement.

AMU Vice Chancellor, Prof. P. K. Abdul Azis rebuts the Times of India story "AMU's Best Guarded Secret: V-C's Date of Birth"

ALIGARH : September 29

Mr. Moinul Hassan, Member of Parliament and Member, AMU Court, in a press statement, has called upon the Ministry of Human Resource Development to withdraw its order issued on August 10, 2011 prohibiting any meeting of the AMU Court without the Ministry?s permission.

Twenty-five members of the AMU Court, including Mr. Hasan, have issued the statement for the press urging MHRD to withdraw the orders forthwith and refrain from imposing any bans or restrictions whatsoever on the AMU Court.

The statement said that by an order issued by the MHRD in the name of the President of India, as Visitor of the Aligarh Muslim University, the University has been barred from holding any meeting of the AMU Court, despite a requirement under Section 34 of the AMU Act and Statute 15(1) that the Court shall meet annually. The Visitor's powers are clearly mentioned in Section 13 of the AMU Act, which do not extend to imposing any departure from the Act, Statutes and Ordinances of the University. Any orders that have 'such effect are, therefore, not only illegal, but an infringement on

Parliament's legislative powers. The orders are also undemocratic and constitute an attempt to subvert the functioning of the AMU Court.

The statement further elaborated that the Act confers no powers on the Visitor to obstruct the operation of the Act and Statutes, as the Ministry's orders have done by banning the meeting of the AMU Court, which by Section 23 (2) of the Act is "the supreme governing body" of the University. The University Act is categorical in stating that the Court has to hold "an annual meeting" to consider the annual report by Section 34 of the Act, as well as the "annual accounts" of the University" vide Section 35(2). The Statute 15(1) prescribes that "the annual meeting of the Court shall be held in the month of October every year on a date to be fixed by the Executive Council, unless some other date has been fixed by the Court itself." The Visitor's orders, as conveyed by the Ministry, are thus in total violation of the provisions of the Act and Statutes, which have made holding of Court meeting an annual mandatory obligation.

The Visitor's orders, issued on the advice of the Ministry, are obviously designed to prevent the Court from having its proper representation on the Executive Council, to which it elects six members directly, and a seventh through the Hony. Treasurer elected by it under Statute 16. The Visitor's ban on the meeting of the Court is obviously designed to keep these elections of its representatives in abeyance, so as to thwart the functioning of the Executive Council, which thereby lacks the quorum for its meetings. Such a measure is not only illegal but also unethical and an unwarranted attack on the autonomy of the University.

It demanded that the MHRD should immediately retrace its illegal steps and call upon the President, as Visitor of the University, to ensure that the provisions of the Act, Statutes and Ordinances are not trifled in her name and so to order that the ban on the meeting of the Court be immediately rescinded.

A group of students of Department of Mechanical Engineering, Zakir Husain College of Engineering & Technology, Aligarh Muslim University has succeeded in developing a mechanism called "Flexible Headlight System for Four-wheeler Vehicles", that improves illumination condition of roads during night driving while taking a turn. The mechanism has been developed as a part of their B. Tech Project.

Flexible Headlight System links the steering of a four-wheeler vehicle to its headlights. It is devised so that the headlight beam rotates in the direction the vehicle is steered, against the fact that conventional headlight beams are always in alignment with the hood of the vehicle. This mechanism aims at improving illumination of road while the vehicle covers a dark or partially dark road turn. This will reduce the chances of road accidents. The Flexible Headlight System will be more useful in hilly regions where roads have frequent sharp turns. In Flexible Headlight System, the headlight beam orientation is controlled by steering itself. This system is claimed to be purely mechanical in nature and no electronic equipment is used which will keep its cost low.

The mechanism has been developed by a group of students comprising Mr. Aslam Adil, Mr. Rafid Suhail and Mr. Mohammad Irfan under the supervision and guidance of Dr. Mohammed Ali, Associate Professor of Department of Mechanical Engineering. Prof. S.M.A. Rizvi, Chairman of the Department and Dean, Faculty of Engineering and Technology has appreciated the great achievement. Prof. S. Manazir Ali, Chairman, Department of Pediatrics introduced Surveillance Medical Officers (SMOs) of NPSP WHO and highlighted the basic objectives of the workshop, mainly, understanding Global Polio Eradication Scenario to understand AFP and the way to identify it, and understanding the roles and responsibilities of the doctors in the AFP Surveillance. He also informed that only one case of Polio has been reported from Howrah till date. The last case of polio was reported from Aligarh (M. A. Nagar) in December 2009.

Dr. Akshay has given the overview of Polio and strategies for eradication of Polio globally. He also emphasized that the world is going through end phase of Polio eradication. So, there is a need to strengthen surveillance activities which includes reporting all AFP cases which are seen on daily basis in the OPD, Emergency as well as the Ward. The SMOs emphasized that reporting atypical AFP case in this phase would intensify the effort and help in detecting "Polio cases" as early as possible so that intervention to stop the epidemic can be initiated at the earliest.

A healthy discussion was held with the residents. Dr. Kamran Afzal, Associate Professor of Pediatrics suggested the Dr. Sudhir to display the photographs of atypical presentation of Polio.

Prof. S. Manazir Ali requested all the residents to actively participate in the surveillance by reporting AFP cases and contribute towards noble cause of eradication of Polio from the Universe. "Osteoporosis is a growing threat to the public health and 36 million patients are afraid to be in India by 2015. It is high time that people should pay attention to their life style and bring necessary changes in their daily routine to prevent osteoporosis become a health challenge in India", said Prof. P. K. Abdul Azis, Vice Chancellor, Aligarh Muslim University while inaugurating the Uttar Pradesh Orthopaedic Association (UPOA) Midterm Symposium on Osteoporotic Fractures organized by Department of Orthopaedic Surgery, J. N. Medical College, AMU and Aligarh Orthopaedic Club.

Prof. Azis said that public awareness drive should also be launched to make people conscious of their daily habits and refrain from prolonged bed rest, low weight, high alcohol consumption, cigarette smoking, low calcium intake and high caffeine consumption not to let the dreaded disease take on them.

Prof. Mohd. Zahid, Chairman, Department of Orthopaedic Surgery and Chairman, Organizing Committee said that Osteoporotic fractures are on rise because of sedentary life style and increasing geriatric population in India and these fractures are difficult to manage. He said that to foresee the enormity of this problem we need to focus on various aspects of these fractures.

Dr. Amir Bin Sabir, Organizing secretary of the Symposium, said that Osteoporosis is the most common ten diseases seen with the age problems. He said that Osteoporotic fractures are a great challenge to the surgeons. He said that

many new drugs are coming to combat osteoporosis and new implant designs also have been developed to treat the osteoporotic fractures.

Prof. M. H. Beg, Dean, Faculty of Medicine said that osteoporosis would become a worldwide problem in near future. He urged the government agencies to pay special focus on its prevention and preventive policies.

Dr. Ashok Gupta, President, Uttar Pradesh Orthopaedic Association, said that more than 300 million people in India are suffering from osteoporosis so that it is our duty to remain updated about this problem. Dr. Gupta said that there is no doubt that in coming years it would be the responsibility of orthopaedic surgeons to face this problem.

Dr. Jamal Ashraf, Secretary, Uttar Pradesh Orthopaedic Association, said that our mission should be to serve the profession, champion the interest of our patients and advance the highest quality of the musculo-skeletal care.

To take an overall review of the developments, allotments and security and other important issues relating to residential halls of the University, a meeting of the Central Allotment Committee of Aligarh Muslim University, presided over by the Vice Chancellor, Prof. P. K. Abdul Azis, was held today at 11:30 am at the VC Lodge.

While addressing the meeting, Prof. P. K. Abdul Azis said that the Provosts should take well care of the resident students and attend to their genuine problems on daily basis. The security of the students and the halls should be given top priority and the halls should be totally insulated from any kind of harmful material, even a knife should not be allowed to carry in the hall by any person. The hall staff should display extreme sensitivity to the security and well being of every students of their respective residential domain, he observed.

Elaborating on the various initiatives, Prof. Azis said that the University has already allocated Rs. 45 lakhs for maintenance and up-gradation of hall facilities like water coolers, chairs, tables and beds as a measure to provide increased comforts to the students. The building committee has recently allocated several Crores of rupees for carrying renovation, repairs and replacement work in all halls of residence with a timeline to complete within three months. The Provosts should assign one of the halls wardens to keep a vigil and ensure the quality of work awarded in their halls, he added.

Prof. M. Saleemuddin, Chairman of the Central Allotment Committee has emphasized on the need to maintain cleanliness in halls including in washrooms and uninterrupted supply of water and power. Personal contact with students and their parents of both the Provosts and the wardens during peace period is essential for effective management of hall affairs, he added.

Prof. Ainul Haque Khan, Dean, Students? Welfare pointed out the individual problems brought to his notice by the students of different halls. He particularly drew attention of the Provosts to the new rule relating to determining seniority of the students, which is based on University standing and not on hall standing.

Proctor, Prof. Mujahid Beg briefed about the new sector scheme put in place in the University and urged the Provosts to extend their full cooperation to make the new system effectively functional so that the student residents in the University halls could be fully protected from the criminal and outside anti-social elements.

ALIGARH : September 16

AMU Vice Chancellor, Prof. P. K. Abdul Azis said that a highly motivated group of detractors were using the platform of AMU Teachers' Association (AMUTA) for unleashing malicious campaign that ultimately denigrate both the venerable office of the Vice Chancellor and the Aligarh Muslim University. The recent memorandum submitted by AMUTA Secretary, Mr. Mustafa Zaidi to the Visitor is nothing but a sequel to the incorrigible design to damage the Aligarh Muslim University, he added.

While clarifying on the issue of presiding over the convened meeting of the Executive Council, Prof. Azis said that AMUTA Secretary's stand on this issue is illegal as the Vice Chancellor has not been found guilty on any of the baseless allegations leveled against him.

Commenting on the curbs imposed on him, the Vice Chancellor said that the restriction is totally illegal. AMUTA leaders are apparently behaving like puppets of certain politicians and the MHRD. The stand taken by them is violation of the AMU Act, he added.

Prof. P. K. Abdul Azis felt that in the guise of appraisal to the Visitor, blatant lies were constantly fed to Hon'ble Visitor's office by the AMUTA Executive without the required mandate of the AMU larger teaching community. Its hidden agenda will cause irreparable damage to the University and its effective functioning.

On the issue of objection raised by Mr. Zaidi, relating to AMU Malappuram Director becoming the member of the Executive Council and other University bodies, the Vice Chancellor said the AMUTA Secretary should read and understand the meaning of the Section 28 (6) and 29(5) of the AMU Act which explicitly states that a new Statute becomes operational with the approval of the Visitor. The Membership accorded to the Director of the Malappuram Centre is as legal as any other action taken under the said provision, he added.

Referring to the description "the much appreciated directives from the Visitor restraining Prof. P. K. Abdul Azis", the AMU Vice Chancellor reiterated that the referred restriction is

totally illegal. The mood of celebration on this count by AMUTA Secretary reflects its total disrespect and disregard to AMU Act as no such curbing provision exists in the Act. Anyone who supports anything that is extraneous to the Act will virtually be doing a great disservice to the University and its legitimate ethos to protect the University structure and its functioning from any illegitimate onslaught. The visionary AMU Act makers have made every provision in the Act to insulate the institution from unwarranted extraneous interference.

Prof. Azis explained that the meeting of the Executive Council scheduled on 17.09.2011 had to be postponed as two members gave a notice of absence, designed to create a 'No Quorum' situation as used to be done by the former eight Executive Council members earlier in similar fashion.

AMUTA representatives and their collaborators could feel happy that they could sabotage the democratic functioning of the Executive Council and the Court where they could never enjoy any worthwhile support in the last four years. Well-meaning teachers should understand the nefarious design with which they are collaborating with the anti-education, anti-Muslim and anti-AMU forces working in the Government and outside, he added.

The University hopes that the Ministry of Human Resource Development would not again fall into the trap laid by AMUTA and others and further harm the interest of the University, the Vice Chancellor concluded.

While taking two other decisions, the meeting decided to postpone the meeting of the Executive Council scheduled to be held on September 17, 2011 at New Delhi.

The members of the Executive Council, Prof. M. Ashraf Malik, Principal, J. N. Medical College and Prof. Sibghatullah Farooqi, Dean, Faculty of Commerce had informed the AMU Vice Chancellor in writing that they were unable to attend the slated meeting of Executive Council to be held in Delhi as it lacked the elected representation of teaching community of the University. The situation thus arisen, compelled the University to postpone the meeting as the total number of EC members presently is 16 which would not allow to meet the quorum requirement if the above two members did not attend the meeting.

It was also decided to urge Prof. Abu Sufyan Zilli, Chairman, Department of Psychology and Chief Election Officer to initiate the election process at the earliest to conduct the election for membership of EC from teaching community. The EC members present in the meeting also decided to urge the Visitor to allow the University to hold the Court meeting so that the election of six members of EC out of the University Court may also be completed so that they could also take part in the process of the selection of the new Vice Chancellor.

They hoped that the Centre will bring laurels to the J.N., Medical College and the AMU and will serve the patients who are suffering from diabetes and other endocrine problems.

Prof. Jamal Ahmad, Director, Rajiv Gandhi Centre for Diabetes and Endocrinology said that the objective of the centre is to provide all facilities to the patients under one roof. He said that the Centre will start Post-doctoral DM and DNB Courses in Endocrinology to strengthen interdisciplinary basic research in the field of Molecular Endocrinology. He said that community oriented programmes, both in urban and rural population, for appraising the common people about diabetes prevention and creating awareness about endocrine disorders will also be started at the Centre. The estimated endocrine disease burden in the country due to these disorders is about 120 million, he added.

Dr. Jamal said that the initiative to start DM (Endocrinology) course has already been approved by the Board of Studies of Faculty of Medicine and the Academic Council. Once approved by the Executive Council of AMU the matter will be taken to Medical Council of India for its final approval.

ALIGARH : September 10

Dr. Hammad Usmani, Assistant Professor and consultant in Pain Clinic of the Department of Anaesthesiology, J. N. Medical College, Aligarh Muslim University said that transforaminal technique is highly effective in the management of patients suffering from sciatica pain.

Dr. Usmani while presenting a paper on "Role of transforaminal epidural steroid injections in patients of Sciatica" at the 16th Annual Advance Pain Conference and Practical Workshop at Budapest, Hungary, said that in this technique, the drug is being deposited directly at the site of inflamed nerve root under image guidance which results in remarkably better pain relief as compared to other conventional approaches. The research work was appreciated by the delegates hailing from different countries.

Check posts have been established on Bab-e-Syed, Purani Chungi, Sir Syed House, Allama Iqbal Hall, Medical College Gate, near the gate of the Proctor?s Office, on the road leading to Dhorra, Tuti Boundary Jamalpur and on the way of Aftab Hall to keep a close watch on all the routes entering in the campus. Security personnel will be deputed on all the check posts round the clock. Assistant Proctors and Deputy Proctors will monitor the security arrangements on regular basis. The University campus has been divided into four sectors and security personnel have been deployed permanently for eight hours on all four halls in each sectors.

To oversee the security of four sectors, four petrol cars have been deployed which will ensure security in their respective areas. Plain cloth security personnel will also be deputed. All these positive actions are outcome of the meeting held under

How could a tiny glass ball become a life threatening object and how could this marble be removed from the food pipe of a neonate? These questions are successfully answered by noted Surgeon Prof. M.H. Beg and Prof. Abdul Qadir, Anesthetist while they performed a rare surgery at J.N. Medical College, Aligarh Muslim University.

The marble piece was said to be put in the mouth of a 22 days old baby Parveen by her elder sibling. The patient belonging to Farrukhabad, was brought to the emergency of J.N. Medical College after the surgeons and endoscopists at Farrukhabad and Kanpur failed to retrieve the marble. Since the patient had acute respiratory difficulty, she was kept in ICU and later referred to CTVS unit. As the patient was in respiratory distress, rigid endoscopy was planned under General Anaesthesia. Although intubation was quite difficult in such small baby, retrieval of the marble was accomplished successfully and without any injury to the baby. The patient recovered well and was finally discharged next day on oral feeds.

Prof. M.H. Beg has retrieved a plethora of foreign bodies from the food and air passages of patients. However, it is for the first time that a marble from the esophagus of such a small baby (Neonate) has been removed successfully. There is no mention of such a case in the world medical literature till date making the

ALIGARH : September 07

The Aligarh Muslim University has achieved a commendable success in developing Information and Communication Technology (ICT) resources in the campus at par with other prestigious institutions in the country.

Prof. Qazi Mazhar Ali, Director, Computer Centre, Aligarh Muslim University said that AMU?s High-speed internet connectivity of 1000 mbps existing under National Knowledge Network (NKN) project was linked to AMU own ITC infrastructure thus giving a big push to IT operations in the University. The entire internet traffic has been migrated to NKN link since last July making it a primary link to manage primary information technology based activities of all kinds in the campus. This has resulted in high-speed data downloading by academic community of the university. The superfast connectivity has made possible the internet link for Worldwide Large Hadron Collider (WLHC) project of the High Energy Physics Laboratory of the Department of Physics to migrate all its high-tech research work to the NKN connected University system.

Prof. Ali further said that the towers required for providing an exclusive 3G/Wimax connectivity to the AMU community through BSNL have been erected and the equipment are installed. He said the connections will be available to the students, research scholars, faculty members and employees very soon.

For the first time the Computer Centre is in the process of extending access to some well-known software packages through the campus wide network. This will facilitate students, faculty members and researchers to use the software at their convenience without duplication of expenditure, he added.

Prof. Qazi Mazhar Ali informed that an online tracking system has been developed to facilitate the retired employees so that they can get from the comfortable confines of their own homes from anywhere in the world the status of their applications without physically visiting the University Administrative Block.

Prof. R.R. Sukul, Director of the Institute of Ophthalmology, J.N. Medical College, Aligarh Muslim University said that the Institute is making sustainable efforts to bring back eyesight to the unfortunate people suffering from permanent blindness.

He said that as a part of its drive against the blindness, the Institute is organizing an eye donation fortnight programme

under the aegis of J.N. Medical College from 25th August to 8th September.

Prof. Sukul said that since its inception six years back, the Eye Bank of the Institute has brought back eyesight to large number of people through corneal transplantation. He said that there are several reasons for the spreading blindness prominent of which are cataract, glaucoma and other corneal problems. He said that the blindness rate in India is 0.5 percent comparing to 1.3 percent before launching of National Blindness Control Programme in 1976. He, however, said that the awareness level among people about eye donation is very low in our

country.

Prof. Sukul observed that people generally fill-up the eye donation form but do not donate their eyes. The family members dither from accomplishing the deceased?s will. He said that a mass level awareness programme is needed to make people aware of the positive aspects of the eye donation. He said that the cornea of deceased remains live till six hours after the death and the doctors get it preserved and used later to provide eyesight to the needy. It is a noble gesture and the people need to rise above all dogmas pertaining to eye donation.

Prof. Sukul said that Eye Bank of the J.N. Medical College is observing Eye Donation fortnight to raise awareness among the people so that they may come forward to donate their eyes. He said that that all services at the Eye Bank are provided free of cost and further details may be had from Prof. Sukul on his mobile no. 9412272009 and Incharge of Eye Bank Dr. Adeeb Alam Khan on 9837252564.

ALIGARH: August 27

The reputation of the Aligarh Muslim University and its functionaries emerged intact. All kind of insidious and irrelevant illusions relating to the hyped up AMU Fact Finding Enquiry's outcomes were set to rest. The copy of the note of dissent by the Chairman of the Fact Finding Enquiry Committee, Justice B. A. Khan obtained under RTI Act and now available in the University has shed new light and given a clean chit to AMU Vice Chancellor and the University.

Former Chief Justice of Jammu and Kashmir High Court, Justice B. A. Khan in his categorical and crystal clear findings has proved beyond doubt on all the crucial first four major complaints the innocence of the AMU Vice Chancellor, Prof. P. K. Abdul Azis and given a clean chit to the University in these regards.

Justice Khan was so dismayed by the conclusion arrived at by its member, Justice A. N. Divecha, a retired Judge of Gujarat High Court that he has declined to append his signature to the report, and instead wrote a long virtual report of findings by observing in the very commencing sentence that "I find myself at odds to go by this line of reasoning and to go along with the Hon'ble member's conclusion. This is so for the reason that I find

no worthwhile basis for this conclusion.

The Chairman's findings concluded that the TA and DA paid to the present Vice Chancellor was found uniformly followed and the act of TA payment would in no case constitute any offence of embezzlement or misappropriation.

While elaborating the issue in question Justice Khan observed that "I also fail to appreciate how this payment of TA/DA to the VC would constitute any offence of embezzlement or misappropriation or for that matter, any misconduct". The University's practice of paying TA/DA to incoming VCs on joining was found uniformly followed and would apply to the present VC also on the principle of equal treatment to which he is entitled. The VC's act would in no case constitute any offence of embezzlement or misappropriation and or misconduct, he added.

Regarding HTC, the Chairman was also categorical in finding that the Vice Chancellor has availed the LTC prematurely and considered the aberration as a curable irregularity as the Vice Chancellor had not drawn any HTC thereafter, though entitled and that in no case would it constitute embezzlement or misappropriation of University funds.

While making a clear distinction between serious financial irregularity he pointed out that the action in question did not and could not constitute offences of embezzlement, misappropriation or for that matter, misconduct. The VC's only fault or mistake was that he enjoyed the facility prematurely before it could become available under the Rules.

Justice Khan while referring to Justice A. N. Divecha's view, asserted that the Honorable Member has accepted the complainants plea and has declared the VC's visit as private. Similarly on the Vice Chancellor's visit to Kochi prior to his visit to Jamia Millia Islamia, New Delhi Justice B. A. Khan's findings revealed that the Vice Chancellor visit to Kochi was scheduled prior to the function at Jamia Millia Islamia and it could not be said or held that he had used the Jamia function as a ploy to visit Kochi and that no University funds could be said to have been unduly consumed by Vice Chancellor in this regard.

On payment of taxi fare, Justice Khan observed that the conclusion that the Vice Chancellor was engaged in a private activity in and around Thiruvananthapuram has no basis in the face of the official record and that the payment of Rs. 15000 to the taxi agency by the University would not amount to any wrongful gain made by the Vice Chancellor.

Giving further clean chit to AMU Vice Chancellor, Justice Khan recorded that Justice Divecha has disregarded and discarded the University's explanation and has declared the activities of the VC as private for which I find no basis. In my view, the nature and character of the functions attended by him, including that of the AMU Old Boys' Association, etc. and his meetings with public figures at various places in and around Thiruvananthapuram had to be best left to University's officialdom to determine and once its administrative set up had treated these as official, the matter should rest at that, he

concluded.

Finally, the Chairman of the Fact Finding Enquiry Committee, Justice B. A. Khan referring to the extraneous issues raised by Justice Divecha, states that ?the Hon'ble Member has concluded his Interim Report by referring to what he calls ?two important communications from one whistle blower" and two applications under the Right to Information Act. "The issues raised are extraneous to the Committee's Terms of Reference. These issues were neither raised nor debated during the Inquiry proceedings and therefore, do not merit any consideration", he asserted.

In the light of the explicit findings of the Chairman of the AMU Fact Finding Enquiry Committee, based on records and documents, any attempt to falsify the facts will be seen as a malicious attempt to deliberately tarnish the image of AMU and its academic and executive head.

The insidious distortions and misinformation campaign unleashed by a well-known group of VC baiters are out to bring discrete with all kinds of wild accusations leading to the unwarranted intervention in the functioning of the University.

Khalid Saifullah, Assistant Professor, Section of Parasitology, Department of Zoology, Aligarh Muslim University presented a research paper titled ?Immunodiagnosis of buffalo amphistomosis by coproantigen detection? at the 86th Annual Meeting of the American Society of Parasitologists held at Sheraton Anchorage Hotel and Spa Anchorage, Alaska (USA).

The conference focused on a number of parasitological research aspects like host-parasite interactions, life cycle and epidemiology, biochemistry, cell biology, physiology, genetics and

The members of this Joint Action Committee request MHRD to withdraw the letter in retrospect with immediate effect and further warns MHRD to abstain from such attacks and interference on the autonomy of AMU.

It is also resolved that initiative be made to meet the President of India, PM, MHRD Ministers and other MPs in Delhi. In this regard, the Joint Action Committee is authorized by the members in this meeting to take required decisions.

The GBM is of the strong view that this letter of the MHRD has tarnished the image of this august institution of learning and education in order to appease a certain section of people, as they have personal gains to be reaped from the present unfortunate situation on the Campus.

Finally, this meeting resolves to continue the democratic means of protest, such as Dharna of the Joint action Committee at Jantar Mantar, New Delhi, burning of the effigies, and others to send a strong message to the UPA government and to those people who have been involved in this malicious act against the University. ALIGARH: August 24

Prof. H. S. A. Yahya, Department of Wildlife Sciences, Aligarh Muslim University, who was deputed by the AMU Vice Chancellor to investigate and report on the recent incident of students' clash in Boys Hostel at AMU Malappuram Centre, Cherukara submitted his report today.

Drawing conclusion after hearing hostel staff, teachers, students, locals and the Director of the Centre, he concluded that there is nothing north-south in the unfortunate episode and a section of the North Indian Urdu and Hindi media displayed immaturity.

While narrating the details, Prof. Yahya reported that on 10th of August a discussion on distribution of Iftar items among students led to heated exchange of words and finally physical injury to four students of MBA, Mohammed Rafi, Yunish Kumar, Shabeeb and Adnan.

Mr. Mohammed Rafi was hit with a stick by Yunish Kumar resulting serious head injury. He was hospitalized; three stitches were made on his head. His condition improved quickly and he has been discharged from the hospital, now he is attending the class as well.

Prof. Yahya observed that there is no harsh feeling among local people towards the students of north Indian origin. However, due to certain rumors, misconception and misunderstanding a sort of gap between north & south Indian students prevailed which was very unfortunate. The local people are very friendly and hospitable, he concluded.

While elaborating, he said that the situation is under control and the Director has taken needed steps to resolve the problem. An internal inquiry committee comprising faculty of the centre was set up. Later on he was also included in the subsequent meetings. After various rounds of talks and perusal the students came forward for the compromise. Mohammed Rafi agreed to withdraw the police case which he had filed against Yunish Kumar. Countering the allegation Mohammed Kumail had also initiated a case against Mohammed Rafi which he withdrew. On Thursday afternoon a joint meeting of alleged students and members of Iftar distribution committee was held and the students unanimously decided to compromise and withdraw all allegations and complaints lodged either with the Director or with the police. They also agreed to undertake an oath of solemn pledge on hundred rupees bond paper assuring that in future they will not indulge in any unruly activity in the hostel or in classroom. Finally members of both group hugged each other and pledged to remain as friends.

Those students who were debarred from the hostel as punitive measure were pardoned and allowed to reside in the hostel. All the students assured that in future there will be no such quarrel which might harm any person or the image of AMU Malappuram Centre vis-à-vis the Aligarh Muslim University. As

a gesture of good will the students of MBA and BA LLB organized an Iftar party in Cherukara Boys hostel on Friday (19th August 2011) in which most faculties, myself and the director also participated. A very healthy and harmonious environment was thus restored in the Boys Hostel.

In the entire episode certain Urdu and Hindi news papers published from north India played a very immature role. They should have verified the news from the reliable sources before publishing entirely wrong news that the students of north Indian origin were beaten and hospitalized. On the contrary, the student who received maximum injury hails from Kerala. Publishing of incorrect news led to misunderstanding among general public and panic to the guardians of north Indian students, he observed.

Prof. Yahya categorically pointed out that the name of Adil Azis, a MBA student, was unnecessarily dragged in this issue whereas the fact is that he was busy in persuading the students to be peaceful and calm during the entire incident. He acted quite maturely and tried to pacify the fighting groups. During my almost one week interaction with the students, cooks of the Hostel, Care taker of the Hostel, and other eye witnesses of the incidence no one reported any wrong doing by Adil Azis.

ALIGARH: August 24

Dr. S. Moied Ahmed, Associate Professor, Department of Anaesthesiology and Consultant In-Charge of ICU, J.N. Medical College, Aligarh Muslim University, was recently invited to co-ordinate and conduct workshop on Mechanical Ventilation at B. R. D. Medical College, Gorakhpur, UP. He was assisted by Dr. Afzal, Assistant Professor, SGPGI, Lucknow, Dr. Lalit Singh, Assistant Professor, SRMS Medical College, Bareilly, Dr. Sabihul Islam and Muzammil Shafi, Junior residents, JN medical College, AMU. The workshop was organized under the banner of Indian Society of Anaesthesiologists.

The workshop was attended by consultants, practicing doctors and junior doctors of different specialty. The workshop initially dealt with the lecture based discussions on how to initiate a patient on a ventilator, what are the parameters to monitor while a patient is on a ventilator, what are the complications that can occur when a patient is on a ventilator and how to wean the patient out of the ventilator. This was followed by the hands on training and discussions on the lung protective strategies of mechanical ventilation in patients with Acute Respiratory Distress Syndrome (ARDS) and Non-Invasive ventilation in patients with Chronic Obstructive Pulmonary Disease (COPD) and Bronchial Asthma.

Dr. Moied has recently received training from Leeds Teaching University Hospital, UK, on the different ventilatory strategies to protect the lungs in ARDS patients. He has been regularly invited both in the State and National Conferences to conduct mechanical ventilation workshop. He is planning to organize a similar workshop on mechanical ventilation in Aligarh

ALIGARH: August 23

The Joint Action Committee of the Teaching and Non Teaching Staff, Technical Staff Association, Fourth Grade Employees Union and Students of the Aligarh Muslim University organized a Dharna in front of the Administrative Block to protest the decision of the Human Resource Development Ministry putting a ban on the executive powers of the Vice Chancellor of the University. The MHRD has sent a letter to the Registrar asking the Vice Chancellor, Prof. P. K. Abdul Azis to refrain from exercising his powers to conduct any Selection committee, make any promotions or take policy decision of long time inferences.

The protesters, representing all sections of the AMU fraternity expressed deep sense of shock and agony on the letter and termed it a violation of Section 13 Clauses (2 to 5) of the AMU Act.

One of the oldest alumni of the University and eminent historian Padma Bhushan Professor Emeritus Irfan Habib said that the University's autonomy was not attacked even during the British rule. He said that the MHRD's unwarranted would adversely affect the life of a number of people attached to this grand old institution as the appointment and promotion of several rightful employees has gone in doldrums.

Prof. Habib said that two fact finding enquiry committees have proved to be inconclusive and the responsibility of this failure lies with the HRD Ministry.

The former Chairman of the Minority Commission of Delhi, Mr. Kamal Faruqui in his address said that the Aligarh Muslim University is the pride of Muslim community and a movement should be initiated against the attack on the autonomy of the University. He said that a handful of vested interests are tarnishing the image of the University. He alleged that the Union Minister, Human Resource Development, Mr. Kapil Sibal is anti Muslim and the employees of National Minority Commission have not been paid their salaries for the last two months. Mr. Faruqui said that the repressive policies of Sibal would create thousands of Anna Hazare. He appealed to the Muslim community to stage dharna in front of the houses of Sibal and Salman Khurshid till the restraining order of the MHRD is withdrawn.

The Joint Action Committee presented a memorandum to the President of India demanding the withdrawal of the decision of MHRD forthwith. It said that it is an attack on the autonomy and functioning of the University provided under Article 29 and 30 of the Indian Constitution, especially Para (3). The MHRD dictat violates the process of appointment of the new Vice Chancellor, whereby the Vice Chancellor is supposed to call the meetings of the University Court after the approval of five recommended names by the Executive Council.

The Committee observed that the decision reflects the vindictive, autocratic and non-receptive attitude of the MHRD to appease a handful of persons within and outside the campus on their misrepresentation of the state of affairs on the Campus. It said that it has jeopardized the functioning of the University by divesting the academic, administrative, financial and executive functioning of the University and further deprived considerably a large number of teachers, nonteaching, technical and fourth Grade employees of the University, who have been denied of their due confirmation, and promotion under Regular, CAS, ACP, MACP, and other categories. This will not only affect them emotionally, but also deny them of various financial benefits pertaining to their gratuity and pension, it added.

The Committee said that names of Visitors' nominee for various faculties are still awaited despite numerous reminders. The unwanted decision shall result in the lapse of over 250 teaching posts under XI Plan and appointment of over three hundred Guest Faculties would be averted, which are generally made in the months of August and September every year because of lack of teachers in various faculties. This will seriously affect the teaching in the University and adversely affect the interest of students of AMU.

It emphasized that the embargo on the Vice Chancellor's executive powers would prevent the processing and releasing of Funds from different sources, leading to the lapse of developmental funds. As a result, funds from UGC and other agencies for DRS, SAP, CAS or for infrastructural developments cannot be utilized.

Dr. M. Rizwan Khan, Convener, Joint Action Committee announced that the Committee will observe one-day token strike on August 25, 2011 and will sit on Dharna at 10.30 am in front of Registrar's Office.

MHRD has also conveyed the Visitor's directives that Vice Chancellor Prof. P. K. Abdul Azis who is completing his term in office on Jan 17, 2012 to refrain from making any appointment and promotion and take any policy decision which may have long term financial or other implications on the executive and academic functioning of the University.

Prof. Rais Akhtar, Visiting Professor, Department of Geology, Aligarh Muslim University delivered a lecture through Teleconferencing to the participants of a Workshop on Climate Change and Human Health, held at Administrative Staff College of India, Hyderabad. The Workshop was organized by Prof. Mala Rao of International Health, University of East London.

In his lecture, Prof. Rais Akhtar highlighted the growing concern both in the developed and developing world about the impact of Climate change on health of population. 2003 Heatwave impact in Europe and 2005 Hurricane Katrina in the United States have given new opportunity in developed countries to understand and accept the significance of Climate Change.

Prof. Akhtar said that in the developing countries, including India, the resurgence and re-emergence of vector borne diseases and increased number of falciparum cases in some regions is a matter of great concern. Besides the altitudinal rise of malaria cases due to warming in highland areas is a great challenge to health planners. Malaria Research Institute is now conducting evidence based studies in Kumaon region and in Mizoram with focus on altitudinal rise of malaria.

Prof. Akhtar emphasized the need to strengthening public infrastructure with regional equity. community capacity is a must in order to protect people and help them to adapt. Improvement in Human Development Index-Access to water and sanitation particularly are very important. **Public** Health Surveillance **Systems** be sufficiently comprehensive and sensitive to detect potential effects of Climate change on health. Heat warning systems should be in place and operational in the eastern coastal areas of Andhra Pradesh and Orissa and take steps to increase public awareness.

According to Prof. Akhtar, there is need to enhance awareness of climate change and impact on health among public health and medical practitioners. He has also been invited to present his paper on Soil trace elements and thyroid cancer at the British Geological Society sponsored Conference on Geology and Medicine, to be held in London in November this year. Prof. Akhtar will be visiting Taiwan in early December to deliver Keynote address at National Cheng Kung University sponsored 2011 Southeast Asia Regional Workshop on Global Environmental Change and Health.

Prof. Abdur Raheem Kidwai, Director, UGC Academic Staff College, Aligarh Muslim University has published his latest book "Translating the Untranslatable: A Critical Guide to 60 Translations of the Quran" by Sarup and Sons, Delhi. The book is a guide to reader how to select a suitable English translation of the Holy Quran for study from a pile of many available in bookshops and libraries.

The remarkable work contains reviews on each of the 60 English translations carried out from 1649 to 2009 and identifies the ideological and sectarian affiliation, mindset, features, and strengths and weaknesses of each and every translator.

Professor Kidwai's masterly work brings out the main contours of the misconceptions and misperceptions about the Quran in the West, as reflected in most of the Orientalist's translations of the Quran, namely those by Ross, Sale, Rodwell, Palmer, Bell and Jones. The critical study of the English translations of Holy Quran seeks to fill the gap in Quran scholarship.

ALIGARH : August 01

The Aligarh Muslim University, in pursuance of the order

of Hon'ble Supreme Court and the Guidelines of the UGC, has completely banned ragging in the campus.

The Dean, Students' Welfare, Prof. Ainul Haque Khan said that the UGC, on the directives of the Supreme Court, framed Guidelines with regard to combating the menace of ragging in the Universities/Educational institutions, according to which ragging, besides being a reprehensible act, is now a punishable offence.

Prof. Khan said that the University considers "ragging in any form" as an act of indiscipline and misconduct and the students found involved in such act shall be punished as per rules prescribed in the 'AMU Students' Conduct & Discipline Rules, 1985, which may include suspension or even expulsion of the student from the rolls of the University or a fine of Rs. 500/extendable upto Rs. 2500/-.

As the University has re-opened after vacation for the session 2011-2012, the students have been informed through notices pasted on various prominent places in the University campus. An undertaking from each student on the prescribed format has also been taken to the effect that he/or she shall not take part in any form of ragging and shall abide by the rules prescribed for the purpose.

ALIGARH :August 01

Professor Ashraf Malik, Principal and Chief Medical Superintendent of the J.N. Medical College at the Aligarh Muslim University issued a notice to all Chairmen of the Clinical Departments. It has been brought to his notice that the patients living with HIV AIDS are being refused admission or shown apathy by the Doctors and Nurses attending them. In the Department of Obstetrics and Gynecology, such patients are isolated in the septic ward. This practice is very unfortunate and tarnishing the image of this Medical College and Hospital.

Prof. Malik emphasized that according to law, no patient can be denied admission or preferential treatment. He requested the consultants to admit such patients and give them sympathetic treatment. The attending Doctors and Paramedical Staff have to follow the universal protection. Further, from now onwards the Medical Superintendent should be informed with the details of such patients on daily basis.

The Vice Chancellor of Aligarh Muslim University has approved the observance of the office timings of all the academic and non-academic departments of the University including Central Offices during the month of Ramadan from 8 am to 2:30 pm (without break) on all working days. On Friday the office timing will be observed from 8 am to 12 noon.

The University has decided that no refreshment should be served on any meeting / function held during the fast so as to maintain the sanctity of the Ramadan.

The University siren shall sound 20 minutes before the closing time of Sahar and at the time of Iftar every day.

ALIGARH: July 30

The Academic Council of the Aligarh Muslim University today unanimously approved the self-financing afternoon classes in both the University maintained Senior Secondary Schools for boys and girls.

The Vice Chancellor, Prof. P. K. Abdul Azis placed before the house the objection raised by the executive body of the AMU Teachers' Association (AMUTA) regarding the afternoon classes of XI standard under self-financing scheme and the house out rightly rejected the opposition of AMUTA in unison.

Similarly, the meeting of the Academic Council unanimously asked the Vice Chancellor to go ahead with the holding of all selection committees including the vacant XI Plan positions.

In order to maintain better residential ambience in all its halls and hostels including discipline, the Central Allotment Committee rules and regulations were approved by the Academic Council.

The Academic Council after thorough discussion declined to consider the court referred case relating to the request of Dr. Romana Hasan, Ex-student of MD, Paediatrics to rejoin and complete her post graduation.

The Academic Council has constituted a sub-committee comprising Prof. Razaullah Khan, Chairman, Department of Civil Engineering, Prof. S. M. A. Rizvi, Dean, Faculty of Engineering, Prof. A. K. Verma, Dean, Faculty of Medicine, Prof. S. Abrar Hasan, former Dean, Faculty of Medicine, Prof. M. Ashraf Malik, Principal and CMS, J. N. Medical College relating to the issue of increase in intake in post graduate courses of Faculty of Medicine as per the faculty decision. The intake suggested was provisionally approved and the committee constituted by the Academic Council will submit its report within 15 days after examining the matter related to increase in intake.

The Academic Council has not approved the request of the guest faculties working in different departments for continuing their appointment till further orders.

ALIGARH: July 29

The developmental work at the Aligarh Muslim University Murshidabad Centre received a big push as a concrete step was taken forward regarding the construction of temporary and permanent building at the site of the Centre in Murshidabad, West Bengal. A consultative meeting with the officials of the Hindustan Steelworks Construction Limited (HSCL), Kolkata, presided over by the AMU Vice Chancellor, Prof. P. K. Abdul Azis, was held today.

A host of financial and technical aspects of the proposal submitted by HSCL pertaining to the construction work at the AMU Murshidabad Centre was discussed in the meeting.

Regarding the construction of temporary structure, the HSCL proposed that the 5009m2 land area will be used for the temporary structure while 50,000m2 area will be raised up to 1.5 meter using fly ask instead of earth due to the cost implications. The boundary walls have been taken into consideration in the estimate with RCC make while a precast posts with barbed wire fencing have been suggested in the proposal.

The construction giant has suggested the road level be 1.5m higher than the ground level while paver blocks have been taken in estimate with adequate base course.

The culvert of the temporary building has yet to be estimated. However, the company has plans for the Soak Pit/Septic Tank and solar panels to be installed after the cost analysis for lighting the campus.

Similarly, the various specifications of permanent buildings were also discussed in the meeting. With almost similar specifications suggested for the temporary buildings, deliberations were made regarding the source of water supply and its distribution to the buildings, lawns and other facilities in campus, water and sewage treatment plants underground internal and external electrification.

With an aim to construct state-of-the-art buildings for the Law and Management Schools, the permanent buildings were decided to be provided with all facilities like digital entry points, modern security system, smart classrooms, modern libraries, seminars, lecture theatres, teachers? cubicles and offices networked and connected with a high speed internet connectivity.

It was decided in the meeting that all the temporary buildings in the campus be provided only with simple specifications to minimize the cost of construction. However it was insisted that estimate should include the extensive planning considering various facilities like water supply, sewage disposal,

internal and external electrification, lighting, furniture, roads and pathways, boundary walls, security cabins, gates etc to make the buildings in ready to use condition.

The meeting was attended by the officiating Registrar and OSD (Development), Prof. Akhtar Haseeb, Finance Officer, Mrs. Yasmin Jalal, Controller of Examination, Prof. Pervez Mustajab, Member, Sub-committee of the Building Committee, Department of Civil Engineering, Prof. Razaullah Khan, Media Advisor, Prof. N. A. K. Durrani, University Engineer, Mr. Firoz Khan and the Deputy Registrar (Development), Mr. Minhaj Ahmad Khan. The HSCL, Kolkata was represented in the meeting by the Chief Architect, Mr. Pradeep Sen, General Manager, Mr. H. T. Azmi, Senior Manager, Mr. Himadri Samaddar and Head, Marketing and Contract, Mr. D. C. Bandyopadhyay.

Medical College is requested to involve Medical College Society for vigilance. Teachers will advice and motivate seniors students not to indulge in ragging. A letter to be sent to all Chairmen regarding this. Posters & banners are to be displayed at prominent places in J.N. Medical College & Dr. Z.A. Dental College regarding evils of ragging & punishment. All teachers & non-teaching staff be requested through their Chairmen to ensure that no incident of ragging is permitted to take place in vicinity of their Chamber/place of work. Chairmen, Department of Anatomy, Physiology & Community Medicine to be requested to ensure that a few teachers are available in college corridor in afternoon after Dissection Class and Practical Class.

Prof. Zahid said that UGC has appointed Prof. Qazi Afzal Husain as the Coordinator and Prof. Mohd. Zahid as Deputy Coordinator.

ALIGARH :July 26

The Aligarh Muslim University is witnessing a new wave of expansion and building construction. Within a short span of three days nearly half a dozen new facilities have been inaugurated. The most unique feature of the current expansion spree is that the buildings were completed in all respect in one go.

The University has bet goodbye to the practice of completing building in piece meal. AMU Vice Chancellor, Prof. P.K. Abdul Azis has initiated a new policy of completing building in all respects including water, electricity and even furniture and furnishing before its inauguration. The process was brought on a fast track and deadlines were monitored as a result a host of buildings have been completed well before the end of the ongoing XI Plan period.

The Vice Chancellor, Prof. P. K. Abdul Azis inaugurated three new buildings. One of them was the extension of 50-bedded ward at A. K. Tibbiya College Hospital. This extended facility was built with a grant of nearly Rs. 1.5 Crore under the AYUSH programme.

The Vice Chancellor also inaugurated at A.K. Tibbiya College today the Engineering College Girls? Students hostel completed under up-gradation scheme of Zakir Husain College of Engineering and Technology involving an amount of Rs. 321.40 Lakh. The new residential facility for the girls includes 64 single-bed rooms with a Dining Hall and a kitchen.

Another major extension was the new facility at Dr. Ziauddin Ahmad Dental College building inaugurated by the Vice Chancellor. The building constructed with a cost of Rs. 76.69 Lakhs, includes three halls at the first floor.

Addressing the inaugural function, Prof. Azis said that this is an era of development and the University must keep pace with the development and growth trend to ward off the decay and decadence. Two Law Schools and two Business Management Schools have already been established in Murshidabad (West Bengal) and Malappuram (Kerala). He announced that two new Unani Medical Colleges will be established at the newly established AMU centres to provide education in Unani system of medicine in these regions.

Prof. Azis said that most of the development plans have been completed within the time limit and the University has given top priority to the development work. The University could be able to get 288 acres of land free of cost for the AMU centres in Murshidabad in West Bengal and 335 acres of land in Malappuram in Kerala. Now the Bihar government has also come forward with the offer of 250-300 acres of land in Kishanganj for the establishment of the AMU Kishanganj Centre.

Commenting on the emerging scenario, Prof. Azis said that relevant files have been submitted to the MHRD and the University would extend full support to complete the process of any enquiry within the shortest possible time. He further observed that it is painful to note that this institution is destroyed by a small set of its own people. Hardly 15 to 20 people were working against the interests of the University but

this small group is lethal enough to damage the image and glory of this historic institution. The AMU has a distinct legacy of honest Vice Chancellors and I am carrying forward this proud legacy with integrity and pride and this fact will certainly emerge and the truth will ultimately triumph.

The man with the steel nerves, Prof. Azis, announced that he will continue to focus on completing the XI plan projects and prepare a vision plan for the XII Plan in next five months for the growth and development of the University so that the new academic vibrancy infused continue to flourish and serve best the community and the nation at large. ALIGARH: July 22

Dr. Izharul Haq Farooqi, Associate Professor,

Environmental Engineering Section, Department of Civil Engineering, Aligarh Muslim University Aligarh has been invited to present a research paper "Removal of 2,4 - Dichlorophenol in a Sequential Anaerobic Hybrid Reactor Submerged Aerobic Fixed Film Reactor System" at the 5th IWA Leading Edge Conference on Water and Wastewater Technologies at Amsterdam, Netherland.

Dr. Farooqi said that Chlorophenols are widely used chemicals in industry as wood preservatives, pesticides, herbicides, biocides and dyes. They are also found in effluents of the pulp and paper industry. They are released in the environment from direct use, accidental spillage, or degradation of other substances and hence are commonly detected in soil, sediments, surface water, and wastewater and can cause severe environmental problems.

He said that Chlorophenols are highly toxic and tend to persist in the environment that is why they have been listed as priority pollutants by the US EP A and the EU.

ALIGARH: July 21

While responding to the warning of hunger strike by Mr. Madeehur Rahman Suhaib, Department of English, Aligarh Muslim University, the University administration said that the new academic session is starting from August 1, 2011 and some enemies of the University and the community are trying to vitiate the peaceful and academic atmosphere of the campus for their vested interests.

AMU Vice Chancellor, Prof. P. K. Abdul Azis has appealed the students and faculty members of the University not to be perturbed by the activities of such elements who are trying to disrupt the academic environment. He urged them to maintain law and order in the campus and desist from such destructive activities.

Prof. Azis said that last time it was a hard decision to close the University sine die after confrontation between the two groups of students. The decision of the sine die closure of the University was a dark chapter. He urged the students to keep away from the politics in the University. He said that the credibility of the Anti-corruption Forum established by Mr. Madihur Rahman is not established as the organization is neither registered under the Society Registration Act nor it has the support of University community.

Mr. Madihur Rahman issued an unsigned appeal during his last stint of hunger strike even after the written appeal by the Vice Chancellor. His earlier hunger strike was a total failure and now he is again trying to disturb the academic atmosphere of the University on the very onset of new academic session.

The Vice Chancellor said that he respected the family of Mr. Rahman as this family has played prominent role in the development of the University. He however regretted that a member of such a distinguished family was working against the

University interests.

ALIGARH: July 21

A project "Strengthening implementation of Child Health and Nutrition Months in UP", sponsored by UNICEF, is running in the Department of Community Medicine. In this connection, Dr. M. Athar Ansari, Nodal Person, BSPM Scheme attended the dissemination and planning meeting on 20 and 22 June, 2010 in Lakhimpur and Sitapur districts respectively to discuss the coverage of Vitamin-A in 9 months to 5 years children in July -2011 round. In these meetings, Chief Medical Officers (CMO) of both the districts, Deputy CMOs, ACMO, DPM (NRHM), DPO & CDPO (ICDS) and Programme Managers of Vatsalya and Beti NGOs were present.

Dr. Athar Ansari also conducted district level training sessions for the July-2011 round of BSPM in both the districts from 6-8 July. In these meetings all medical officers in-charges (MOICs) of community health centres, primary health centres, health education officers (HEO), immunization officers (IO), health supervisors (HS) from the health department and CDPO and supervisors (Mukhya Sevika) from ICDS department were invited. The objective of training was to sensitize the officers of Health and ICDS departments on Vitamin A coverage, breast feeding promotion, complementary feeding and promotion of consumption of iodised salt in the community. The training also provided an insight into programme implementation gaps and bottlenecks and identified areas requiring improvement for the next round.

Dr. Ansari was assisted by Prof. Zulfia Khan, Dr. A.R. Siddiqui and Dr. S.N.A. Hashmi during the training of nearly 200 officers of health department and ICDS department in Lakhimpur and Sitapur.

ALIGARH: July 20

The Jawaharlal Nehru Medical College of Aligarh Muslim University has been ranked among the top 25 Medical Colleges of India out of 273 Medical Colleges recognized by the Medical Council of India.

AMU Vice Chancellor, Prof. P. K. Abdul Azis said that the J. N. Medical College will soon witness further strides both in terms of academic achievements and technological and professional facilities as the University has put in place a well conceived action plan for strengthening its existing facilities under the grant of Rs. 150 Crore from the Pradhan Mantri Swasthya Suraksha Yojna.

Prof. M. Ashraf Malik, Principal and CMS, J. N. Medical College said that the survey published by India Today in its latest issue of 18th July 2011 has ranked J. N. Medical College 22nd among the top 25 Medical Colleges of India. Prof. Malik urged the staff and students of the College to work hard to achieve

better ranking in 2012.

ALIGARH: July 20

A Consultative Meeting of Deans of Faculties chaired by the Vice Chancellor, Professor P.K. Abdul Azis today approved the proposal to introduce XI Classes under Self-finance scheme as was being done last year subject to the approval of the Academic Council meeting to be held on July 30, 2011.

AMU Registrar and Manager of the University maintained Schools, Prof. V.K. Abdul Jaleel said that additional sections will be started as afternoon classes subject to availability of infrastructure facilities. One section will be opened for the each class under science and commerce streams in the Senior Secondary School (Boys) and one section each for science, commerce and Arts stream will be opened at the Senior Secondary School (Girls).

The proposal was submitted by the Controller of Examination, Prof. Pervez Mustajab and approved by the Deans. Eighty percent seats in each streams will be offered to AMU Schools' students and rest 20% seats will be filled by nomination by the Vice Chancellor without category.

Registrar, Prof. V.K. Abdul Jaleel appealed to all agitating students to withdraw their protest and cooperate with the University administration.

ALIGARH: July 18

A Consultative meeting under the chairmanship of AMU Vice Chancellor, Professor P.K. Abdul Azis today examined in detail the issue relating to accommodating maximum number possible of students of AMU Schools who could not get admission in Class XI by opening the self finance afternoon sections as was being done last year.

The Vice Chancellor has instructed the Controller of Examinations to prepare a detailed framework for the consideration and placement before the meeting of the Dean of the faculties slated for Wednesday.

The matter of accommodating AMU Schools' students in the XI class will be worked out in accordance with the availability of infrastructure.

Prof. Pervez Mustajab, Controller of Examination has explained the last year arrangements. The members are of the view that the AMU schools should be brought in line with the RTE policy of the government and to be upgraded to XII standard.

AMU Registrar and Manager of Schools, Prof V.K. Abdul Jaleel, Dean, Students' Welfare, Prof. Ainul Haq, Finance Officer, Mrs. Yasmeen Jalal, Proctor, Prof. Mujahid Beg and media Advisor, Prof N.A.K Durrani were present in the consultative meeting.

ALIGARH :July 16

Four new courses - Interdisciplinary Subject Refresher Course in Research Methodology in Business Studies, Research Methodology in Social Science, Refresher Course in History and Orientation Programme commenced today as part of the UGC Academic Staff College, Aligarh Muslim University.

More than hundred (100) Course participants are enrolled in these courses. These course participants are from Assam, Andhra Pradesh, Bihar, Chandigarh, Karnataka, Kerala, Maharashtra, Tamil Nadu, West Bengal, UP and Uttarakhand. Professor Badar Alam Iqbal, Department of Commerce, AMU; Professor Mirza Asmer Beg, Department of Political Science; Dr. Ali Athar, Department of History and Professor A.R. Kidwai, Director, UGC Academic Staff College are the Course Coordinators of these Courses respectively.

While welcoming the Course Participants Professor A.R. Kidwai, Director, UGC Academic Staff College brought out the role of the UGC Academic Staff College courses in academic excellence, social cohesion and personality development. He also familiarized them with Sir Syed?s mission of social engineering. Eminent resource persons, including technocrats, public figures and academicians will deliver lectures and interact with the course participants. Visits to the University campus, MA Library and science lab have also been organized. These courses will conclude in early and mid-August respectively.

ALIGARH: July 15

The Vice Chancellor of Aligarh Muslim University, Prof. P. K. Abdul Azis has taken a tough posture on improprieties in the selection process of Faculty of Law with respect to the scrutiny of applications conducted by the Dean cum Chairman of the Faculty of Law.

As soon as the cases of favouritism and nepotism came to his notice, the entire selection committee for various posts in the Faculty of Law scheduled for July 14, 2011 was postponed.

The Registrar, Prof. V. K. Abdul Jaleel clarified that the postponement was based on two cases of improprieties that were noticed on July 13, 2011. It was seen on the file that the first case was related to the submission of an application by the Visitor's nominee for Selection Committee in the Law recommended by the Dean suggesting the appointment of the Visitor?s nominee as a Scholar-in-Residence. The Act of recommending the Visitor?s nominee for a position of Scholar-in-Residence was designed to influence the Visitor?s nominee in the selection process and such an act is a very serious impropriety committed by the Dean, Faculty of Law.

The second was the impropriety of making a number of eligible candidates ineligible while the candidate on serial number 9 was declared as the only candidate eligible for the post of Professor.

Both the improprieties were viewed by the University as very serious and sought justification of the Dean for his

recommendations.

The Vice Chancellor has always taken prompt action in all forms of improprieties whenever such cases came or brought to his notice.

AMU Registrar said that during the last four years, the Vice Chancellor, Prof. P. K. Abdul Azis has made all admissions and appointments in a fully transparent manner as per the rules and regulations of the University. There were no financial irregularities, violation of the Act and Statutes. The CAG report of 2008-2009 and 2009-2010 had clarified that the University has followed all the principles of financial management.

AMU Vice Chancellor, Prof. P. K. Abdul Azis was elected in 2007 by the Executive Council and the University Court with the largest number of votes in the history of AMU on the basis of his outstanding academic qualifications and other credentials in research and administration.

Referring to the objection to the presence of Prof. Azis as head of the Selection Committees, Registrar said that the Vice Chancellor is fully empowered to conduct Selection Committees so long he is in his office.

AMU Vice Chancellor thanked the Ministry of Human Resource Development that the two-member Fact finding Enquiry was "wound up" in the wake of the order of the President of India in her capacity as the Visitor of the University.

The Registrar said that the University has not received any information regarding the CBI or any other enquiry against the present Vice Chancellor.

ALIGARH: July 15

Lakshit Sood, Tennis Player of Aligarh Muslim University has been selected for Advance Training Camp for participation of Indian Universities Contingents in the World University Games at Shenzen, China. Prof. Tariq Mansoor, Secretary, University Games Committee said that it was a matter of great honour for AMU player for being selecting in the great event. He hoped that Mr. Sood will bring laurels to his Alma Mater. Prof. Mansoor said that the World University Games is scheduled to start from August 12-23, 2011.

ALIGARH: July 15

The Aligarh Muslim University has decided not to open the additional afternoon XI standard classes as it was done last year on compassionate ground.

The University had started Plus Two afternoon section as a social obligation but the move proved to be failure. It brought down the overall performance of results and students? achievements of the Senior Secondary Schools owing to the additional load and pressure on both the teachers and school resources.

The Academic Council of the University in its meeting held

on February 7, 2011, reviewed the issue and decided to stop the continuation of additional classes of XI standard. Therefore, there will be no opening of the afternoon class section of XI standard in the current academic session in the University.

ALIGARH: July 14

Releasing the Annual Hall Magazine of Mohsinul Mulk Hall, the Vice Chancellor of Aligarh Muslim University, Prof. P. K. Abdul Azis said that the country needs more Aligarh Muslim Universities and this institution has gained national reach by establishing its centres.

He said that replicating AMU is the new mission and it needs sustained and dedicated initiative. Prof. Azis said that villagers of Kishanganj in Bihar are crying for AMU Centre.

Prof. Azis said that Malappuram and Murshidabad Centres have taken shape and now Bihar Government and the people are offering land to establish AMU Centre before he completes his tenure as the Vice Chancellor. In view of all these developments, the University administration deemed it most appropriate to postpone the General selection Committee in the Faculty of Law.

The fact-finding Inquiry Committee constituted under Section 13(2) of the AMU Act by the President of India in her capacity as the Visitor of the University to enquire into allegations against the Vice Chancellor as also the counter allegations against the complainants stand wound up with effect from the date of submission of the Interim Report by the Inquiry Committee.

The Registrar of the Aligarh Muslim University, Prof. V.K. Abdul Jaleel received yesterday the Office Order issued by the Director (CU), Department of Higher Education, Ministry of Human Resource Development, Government of India informing that in pursuance of the President?s Secretariat office order dated June 9, 2011, the AMU fact Finding Inquiry Committee stands dissolved w.e.f. 21.03.2011.

ALIGARH: July 13

Prof. Zafar Ahsan, Department of Mathematics at the Aligarh Muslim University has been invited to deliver lectures at University of Malaya and International Islamic University, Malaysia during July 15-28, 2011. During his visit, he will deliver a series of three lectures on the applications of mathematics at the Institute of Mathematical Sciences. University of Malaya and one public lecture each at the University of Malaya and International Islamic University on "The Quran and Modern Cosmology". Prof. Ahsan will also be titled delivering an invited talk "Analogies electromagnetism and gravitation in general relativity" on July 23, 2011 at the Seminar on Mathematical Sciences 2011 organized by Institute of Mathematical Sciences, University of Malaya.

Prof. Ahsan is the Member of Research Board of Advisors, American Biography Institute (USA); Editor-in-Chief of Journal of Tensor Society of India, Managing Editor of Aligarh Bulletin of Mathematics; Members of Editorial Board of Journal of Calcutta Mathematical Society, International e-Journal of Numerical

Analysis and related topics and Bulletin of Pure and Applied Mathematics; Referee of various journals of mathematics and physics.

Prof. Zafar Ahsan has been working on general relativity. He has so far published 70 research papers in national and international journals of repute. He has participated in 52 conferences in India and abroad and has presented his work as an invited speaker in 30 conferences. He has published 04 books and all these books are prescribed as textbooks in several Indian and foreign universities. His book on Differential Equations (2nd Edition, 2004, Twelfth reprint, April 2010) is a bestseller since 1999.

His current research interest, apart from General Relativity and Gravitation, is on Quran and Modern Cosmology and he has delivered public talks on this topics at a number of places like Tabriz (Iran); Vallabh Vidyanagar (Gujrat); Jamia Millia Islamia (New Delhi); Integral University, Lucknow (Uttar Pradesh); Islamia College, Gorakhpur (Uttar Pradesh); Jamea-tul-Hidayat (Jaipur); Paigham-e-Noor Haque Conference, Jagdishpur (Uttar Pradesh); Azad Girl's School, Shimoga (Karnataka); Tasmia Educational Society, Dehradun (Uttra Khand) and AMU.

ALIGARH: July 13

Prof. Emeritus John C. Miller, Fulbright scholar from University of Colorado, USA gave a workshop on Teaching Speaking Strategies as part of English Access Mircrosholarship Program (EAMP) Teacher Training Programme at UGC Academic Staff College, Aligarh Muslim University here on Wednesday.

Prof. Miller talked about task-level techniques in relation to multi-level activities in ESL Classrooms and he stressed the need for designing language activities. ALIGARH: July 13

A group of researchers of Aligarh Muslim University led by Prof. Wasim Ahmad of Department of Zoology has discovered a new genus of soil-inhabiting nematode from the grasslands in Kaziranaga National Park, Assam.

The team's finding published in the latest issue of Nematology (an International Journal of Nematology, published from The Netherlands), says newly found nematode is quite unique despite its close resemblance with another closely related genus, Pachydorylaimus with all its species recorded only to Central America. The present finding bears biogeographical importance. The authors have named this new genus and species as Rhinodorylaimus kazirangus, because of the flagship animal species, Rhinoceros unicornis, a rare species of rhino restricted to this park only. The characteristic robust odontostyle (feeding apparatus) of R. kazirangus brings it close to some of the rare

genera of dorylaim nematodes with very restricted distribution, such as Pachydorylaimus (only in Central America), Metadorylaimus (restricted to Malavi) and Silvalus (a genus which Prof. Ahmad described from Silent valley way back in 1986 and has so far not been recorded from anywhere else).

Dr. Baniyamuddin, Prof. Ahmad's student, a Post-Doctoral Fellow initiated research on nematode biodiversity of Kaziranga National Park under a DST sponsored Young Scientist Research Project. They have earlier described several new species of soil inhabiting nematodes from Northeast, especially Arunachal Pradesh.

Prof. Wasim Ahmad said that the Northeast is at the junction of the Indo-Myanmar global biodiversity hotspot. The biodiversity of this region, especially the below ground diversity have remained completely neglected. The nematodes constitute a major part of below ground diversity and play a very significant role in soil ecosystem because of their key position in soil food web. They feed on most soil organism and are themselves food for many others. In recent years they have become a major tool of soil ecologists in bio-monitoring. "For decades we have been looking only at the above ground diversity of national parks and sanctuaries, neglecting the importance of below ground fauna. There is an urgent need to study the below ground fauna, especially nematodes because of their significant role in nutrient cycling", he added.

Prof. Ahmad has earlier worked on the nematode fauna of national parks in Japan, Singapore and the world's famous hot spot of biodiversity, the INbio National Park of Costa Rica. Related Picture 1. Wasim Ahmad

The move to establish Kishanganj Centre of the Aligarh Muslim University received a fresh impetus triggering a new hope in the minds of the people of the region.

The AMU Vice Chancellor, Prof. P.K. Abdul Azis on the invitation of Kishanganj District Magistrate has visited the town along with a team of senior faculty members and inspected the three land areas identified by the Bihar Government.

The first site was situated in Dhanpura village comprising 245 acres of land situated about 23 kilometers from the district headquarters. The second site which was inspected by the team comprising 250 acres was situated in Tarabari and the third one comprising 250 acres was situated at Petbhari village. Besides this, on the advice of District Collector, the AMU team also visited the fourth site situated near the Bagdogra-Kishanganj Expressway.

While addressing to the media persons, AMU Vice Chancellor, Prof. P. K. Abdul Azis said, ?It is our firm commitment to take up the cause of AMU Kishanganj Centre on a fast track basis. The AMU wishes to introduce its programmes in current academic session provided the land is acquired and

transferred to the University within three months? period of time.

Prof. Azis said that the Central Government, Government of Bihar, the people of Kishanganj and the Aligarh Muslim University, all are supporting this great educational initiative that is likely to change the face of the region.

Prominent public representatives including Mr. Akhtarul Iman, MLA and representatives of various local educational movements met the AMU visiting team and requested to translate their dreams of having a modern educational institutions of historical significance.

The Kishanganj District Collector, Mr. Sandeep Kumar who accompanied the visiting team to the three identified plots, promised all help and said that he is going to initiate the process of land acquisition on a priority basis.

The team after preliminary evaluation has short listed priority of the site which were offered to AMU. The first option which the team considered most suitable for the AMU Centre was the three-pieces land at Chakla village offered to AMU earlier. The University has expressed its desire to take over this piece of land contiguous in one piece starting from Plot No. 1 (lying beside the state highway). It should be made one piece and contiguous as requested by the University on the very next day of the first visit on May 23, 2010, University added. The second option preferred by the University was the Dhanpura land and the third option was Tarabari land.

The Vice Chancellor in the interactive meeting with Kishanganj Collector has said that the University is open to any other option if Bihar Government wants to explore the possibility for establishing AMU Centre on some other land in Kishanganj. Our only concern at this moment is that the Bihar Government should hand over 250 acres of contiguous land without any encumbrances and it should be securely bound.

The other officials who participated in the meeting included Mr. Siyaram Singh, SDM, Kishanganj, Mr. Uday Kishore Yadav, Circle Officer, Kishanganj, Mr. S.K. Chaudhary, ADM, Kishanganj and Dr. Mahendra Pal, Land Acquisition Officer, Kishanganj.

Dr. A. K. Mittal, Chief Medical Officer, Loknayak Hospital, Delhi delivered a lecture on 'Overview of Haemophilia' organized by the Department of Paediatrics, J. N. Medical College, Aligarh Muslim University.

Dr. A. K. Mittal emphasized upon the need to take a detailed history including history of similar illness in the maternal relatives of a patient with suspected haemophilia. He also gave some useful practical tips for managing acute bleeding episodes in such patients. Dr. Mittal observed that besides the medical and orthopaedic problems being faced by these patients, a number of social and psychological issues were also involved which need to be addressed with care. He laid emphasis on the establishment of a Comprehensive Hemophilia Care Centre involving Physicians, Pathologists, Surgeons, Orthopaedic Surgeons, Dental Surgeons, Psychologists and Counselors. A good laboratory set up was the back bone of any such centre. He also talked about the importance of carrier detection, ante-natal screening and counseling.

Dr. Mittal also distributed copies of ?Guidelines for Management of Hemophilia by World Federation of Hemophilia? to the Participants.

Dr. Mittal along with Dr. Naresh Gupta has played a key role in establishing a Hemophilia Day Care Centre in the Loknayak Hospital, Delhi where comprehensive care is being provided to patients.

Janaki Ammal National Award, the highest award for Animal Taxonomy instituted by the Ministry of Environment and Forests, Government of India. He received this prestigious award from Mr. Jairam Ramesh, Hon?ble Minister of Environment and Forest, Government of India and Mr. Achim Steiner, UN Undersecretary General and Executive Director, United Nations Environment Programme (UNEP) at a World Environment Day programme in New Delhi. The award carries a medallion, a scroll, a citation and a cash prize of Rs. 1,00,000/-. Dr. D. B. Singh, Director, Botanical Survey of India received the Award for Plant Taxonomy. Dr. Ahmad is the youngest to have been honored with this award since its inception in 1999 by the Government of India.

Dr. Ahmad is an Internationally acclaimed nematode taxonomist with over three decades of research experience in soil nematode fauna of different geographical regions of India. He has described several hundred new taxa of nematodes. He has also the distinction of describing large number of new nematode taxa from over twenty different countries of the world.

Dr. Ahmad has several books and monographs to his credit published by the world renowned publisher, E.J. Brill, Leiden, the Netherlands. He has visited many countries as an expert of nematode taxonomy and is recipient of prestigious visiting fellowships from Royal Society, London (UK), Dutches Forschungsgemeinschaft (Germany), Japanese Society for Promotion of Science (Japan), Erasmus Mundus Scholar (European Union), Chinese Academy of Sciences (China), Third World Academy of Science (Italy), Korean Science Foundation (Korea), Raffles Museum Visiting Fellowship (Singapore), Institute Nacional de Biodiversidad (Costa Rica) etc.,

Dr. Wasim's international recognition can be ascertained from the fact that in 1996, scientists from the British Museum Natural History, London named a new genus of nematode Wasimellus enigmatus Bloemers & Wanless in recognition of his contribution to Nematode taxonomy. This is a very rare recognition for an Indian Scientists to achieve at international level. His admirers have dedicated several other new species in

ALIGARH: June 21

Inaugurating a workshop on "Energy Conservation", the Vice Chancellor of Aligarh Muslim University, Prof. P. K. Abdul Azis said that the University has submitted a proposal to the Union Minister of New and Renewal Energy for setting up of an Indo-US Energy Centre in the University and Dr. Farooq Abdullah has promised to clear the project.

He said that the increasing electricity consumption is a serious matter and urged the University community to adopt possible corrective measures including use of modern edge technology. Prof. Azis said that the University has sanctioned Rs. 4.5 Crores for outdated wiring replacement in the campus.

Prof. Azis said that the University has invited two energy experts, Mr. Sandeep Garg of Ministry of Power and Dr. Masood Akhtar, President, Cleantech Partners Inc., Wisconsin, USA. Both the energy experts are the product of this great institution. He said that hundreds of old boys of this University have touched his heart during the last four years.

Earlier, Prof. Anwaruddin Anwar, Member-in-Charge, Electricity Department of University said that the AMU is a big consumer of UPPCL with sanctioned load of 6.1 MVA and the power is received through two 33 KV lines.

Prof. Anwar highlighted the energy consumption breakup of the University and said that 66% energy was used in the Departments of studies, offices, tubewells, street lights while 22% consumption is recorded in the halls of residence. Only 12% energy was used in mobile towers and staff quarters.

Prof. Anwar suggested the power saving initiatives such as implanting solar geysers in all halls of residence, solar street lights and promotion of use of CFL in the campus. He also suggested that use of energy efficient air conditioners and fans be increased.

Dr. Masood Akhtar, President, Cleantech Partners, Inc., Focus on Energy, Wisconsin, USA said that energy cooperation is a central element of the US-India Strategic Partnership. During President Obama?s visit to India in November 2010, the US Department of Energy (DOE) and the Government of India signed an agreement to establish a Joint Clean Energy Research and Development Centre designed to promote clean energy innovation by teams of scientists and engineers from India and the US in the field of energy efficiency of buildings, second-generation bio-fuels and solar energy.

Dr. Sandeep Garg, Bureau of Energy Efficiency, Ministry of Power, Government of India said that Indian per capita energy consumption is 530 kgoe while the world average is 1770.

He said that in India energy demand is increasing due to rising income, accelerated industrialization, urbanization and population growth. He urged to educate consumers for making energy efficient purchases.

Medical College and Proctor, Aligarh Muslim University said that morbidity and mortality rate among infants and children in Uttar Pradesh is still a matter of serious concern. It is the doctors? duty to take concrete steps for rectifying the situation. Prof. Beg was addressing the valedictory function of 6th batch of Training of Trainers (ToT) under the auspices of "Comprehensive Child Survival Programme" (SSCP) for Medical Officers of Uttar Pradesh in collaboration with UNICEF & National Rural Health Mission (NRHM) held at the Department of Paediatrics, Jawaharlal Nehru Medical College.

Prof. Beg said that about 105 lakh children died under the age of five years every year in the world. In India 22 lakh children die under the age of five years every year. He urged the Doctors to treat the patients in friendly atmosphere and make efforts to bring down the mortality rate.

Prof. S. Manazir Ali, Chairman, Department of Paediatrics and Coordinator of the programme said that a considerable decline has been witnessed in the death rate among the newborn babies but efforts should be made from the very first hour of birth to defeat death taking on our children. Prof. Ali said that more than 1200 children every hour and more than 20 children under age of five years die every minute at a rate of one child dying every 3 second. He said that the comprehensive child survival programme is run under the rural health mission keeping in view this objective.

Prof. Abdul Mateen, Chairman, Department of Sociology and Social Works urged the doctors to work hard to bring the benefits of health care mission to the rural areas and ensure safety of the newborn babies.

The Service Book and Pension Section of the Aligarh Muslim University has been the least attention paid department for last several years that ultimately resulted in inadvertent delay in processing the service book issues, retirement papers, pension related applications and verification and documentation of papers of present employees of the University. The delay was always attributed to the improper maintenance and upkeep of a large number of Service Book due to shortage of space and other resources. But all these issues have become a matter of past after the automation of the Service Book and Pension Section.

The Vice Chancellor of Aligarh Muslim University, Prof. P. K. Abdul Azis took special interest in the activities and functioning of this section and provided all support and guidance for improvement in its functioning. According to Mr. Nazim Jafri, Deputy Registrar, Service Book and Pension, efforts and effective measures by Prof. Azis have borne positive result and greatly helped in streamlining the Service Book and Pension Section.

Data entry of about 6631 Service Book of the existing employees, computerization of record of 5452 pensioners with 2036 family pensioners and computerization of nomination forms of Gratuity of all the employees of the university in a classified manner were the most important achievements that could be made possible within a short period of time, he added.

The initiatives have made the job easy for quick disposal and settlement of matters relating to pensions, family pension and verification of the documents of the existing employees and the retirees.

Now, the university is in a commanding position to process the case expeditiously with minimum human intervention. The impotant information relating to the pension will be displayed on the internet. The list of retirees of the coming calendar year will be made available on the net so that the concerned employees can check the movement of their pension file sitting in their home itself.

ALIGARH: June 10

Prof. P. K. Abdul Azis, an eminent marine scientist, assumed the distinguished office of the Vice Chancellor on June 10, 2007. He is completing four years in office today. Although there were anxious moments of difficulties, turbulences and three sine die closures of the University, Prof. Azis was able to stir the University and bring it back on a resurgent track. With an amazing quality of simplicity combined with steel nerve, he relentlessly carried forward a new vision of development of cutting-edge technology and expansion unprecedented in the history of AMU. A brief look at the major developments initiated by Prof. P. K. Abdul Azis bears testimony to the service he

rendered to the community and the nation at large as AMU Vice Chancellor.

Prof. Azis is the moving spirit and the working force behind getting the approval of the Central government to set up five AMU centres across the nation, one each at Murshidabad (West Bengal), Malappuram (Kerala), Kishanganj (Bihar), Maharashtra and Bhopal (Madhya Pradesh). He is instrumental in establishing two centres of the Aligarh Muslim University at Malappuram and Murshidabad and making them functional by launching BALLB and MBA programmes. His efforts have brought to AMU fold an additional, almost 800 acres of land free of cost. The Bihar Government is providing 250 acres of land to establish AMU Centre at Kishanganj. The Maharashtra Government has also announced its desire to consider setting up of AMU Centre in the state.

Prof. Azis implemented an action plan to bring into the University fold the cutting-edge Information and Communication Technology. The University installed more than 700 computers with high speed internet connectivity in each department of study, hall of residence so that the student and staff can reap the benefits of campus wide bandwidth expansion round the clock. Within a short span of four years the AMU has witnessed a phenomenal growth in ICT from 0.05 mbps in 2007 to almost 1054 mbps bandwidth. The Aligarh Muslim University will soon emerge as a modern educational technology hub contributing significantly to both knowledge acquisition and knowledge creation. The Bluetooth enabled WiMax system brought with his efforts will bound to change the educational scape in the University.

Realizing the productive dimension of global interaction and exposure of reputed international academic institutions, Prof. Azis has put in place a plan for mutual cooperation. During his visit to United States he signed MoUs with several leading universities including Wisconsin and Cleveland, Atlanta, Boston, Georgia State, Youngstown State, New York University and Massachusetts University. In the current academic session alone, AMU has signed eleven Memoranda of Understanding (MoU) with leading institutions and establishments of national and international repute.

Several building projects of X Plan whose funds lapsed, were brought back and got completed by special efforts made by Prof. Azis. He is behind getting several important building projects getting approval under X Plan. With a view to give a big push to infra-structure development, Prof. P. K. Abdul Azis has recently approved building projects involving a total expenditure of Rs. 2482.7 Lacs. The University approved eleven major building projects under XI Plan involving a total expenditure of Rs. 2115.4 Lacs to be completed by Central Public Works Department (CPWD) by March 2012. The Building Department of the University has been assigned 14 works involving a total expenditure of Rs. 367.06 Lacs which will be completed by July 31, 2011. In the next academic session a new girls' hostel for

Engineering students, a University Canteen with modern kitchen, new classrooms and extension of library building for the Islamic Studies department and new faculty building for Social Sciences will be available to students and staff of the University.

With a view to mitigate the financial difficulties of thousands of retired employees and family pensioners of AMU, Prof. Azis has launched a special drive to provide financial succor to family pensioners. The University got processed 5452 cases of pensioners out of which 2036 were family pensioners and approved the new pension payment as per the enhanced rate of sixth Pay Commission.

The Sports Authority of India has sanctioned an amount of Rs. 3.5 crores for Astroturf. This would help the University provide national and international level players of hockey once again, a hallmark of AMU. The University Grants Commission has sanctioned Rs. 50 Lacs for an Indoor Sports Complex, which will be constructed soon. The University has renovated Roller Skating Rink at the cost of Rs. 20 Lacs and with this, it has become the largest Roller Skating Rink among the Indian universities.

During Prof. Azis's regime, AMU has introduced several new courses as parts of its scheme of academic expansion. The most recent additions were Master course in Women's Studies, PG Diploma in Conflict Resolution and Peace Studies (CRPS) and Advance Diploma in Interior Decoration.

Prof. P. K. Abdul Azis has given extra priority to the issue of research projects. His initiatives have started yielding results and now a greater number of the departments are getting aid under Special Assistance Programme and assistance from other funding agencies. AMU teachers got individual projects worth nearly 10 Crores in the last three years and now AMU stands 3rd among the central universities in research articles publication in international journals of repute. The Department of Science and Technology has selected AMU for a funding of Rs. 9 Crores as recognition to the University for its contribution in the field of research publications. More than 300 AMU students were getting PhD annually under various faculties.

The Vice Chancellor's personal interest and interventions resulted in the Government of India sanctioning Rs. 150 Crore under the Second Phase of Pradhan Mantri Swasthya Suraksha Yojna (PMSSY) for the up-gradation of Jawaharlal Nehru Medical College. The University will have a new wing of Gynaecology and Neonatology, College of Nursing, modern kitchen, modern laundry and new OPDs.

During Prof. Azis's regime, the Aligarh Muslim University has conducted 260 General Selection Committees and appointed/promoted 431 faculty members including Principals of Colleges and schools. University has also conducted general selection committees for a number of vacant non-teaching positions.

His constant pursuit has resulted in the establishment of a state-of-the-art Digital Resource Centre in the University Library which is linked to campus wide network and the National

Knowledge Network extending online access to more than two lakh books and thousands of online journals along with the great treasure of knowledge of NKN to all departments of studies, halls of residence and other University offices.

Often Prof. P. K. Abdul Azis conducted special drives for infusing transparency and speed in administrative dealings. As a result most of the things were improved now more transparent information is available on the website. Examination and admission reforms were introduced. OMR sheets are given to candidates appearing in admission tests, online hall tickets can be seen for ready reference, extra precautions were taken to avoid any inconvenience to candidates appearing in admission tests. Finance management has improved and audit reports were ok. Solving pension problems pending for last four decades has been a big achievement. Legitimate dues have been paid, several selection committees have been conducted, appointments have been made and on a fair basis, there has been no complaint. He was able to provide AMU a very clean, honest and transparent administration. He established several admission test centres across the country. Earlier, it was only in Aligarh but now one can find AMU Test centres in Srinagar, Patna, Bhopal, Lucknow, Hyderabad and Kozhikode. Candidates number has increased.

AMU is a happening institution now, numerous construction activities have been going on in the campus in different locations. Urdu Academy is ready to be inaugurated, Dental College building is ready, University will be going to lay the foundation for M. A. Library block, 1000 seats girls' hostel then new faculty building and it has set apart Rs. 20 Crores for developing campus roads, strengthening water supply, augmenting electricity supply.

M. A. Library has Digital Resource Centre, departments can have access to library. Within a period of one year all classrooms are going to be converted into Smart Classrooms, campus is becoming WiFi in another 15 days. So this is repositioning the University on a cutting edge area of technology with ICT available on finger tips of every student and teacher. Related Picture

Professor Mujahid Beg, Proctor of the Aligarh Muslim University has issued a show cause notice to 24 students who were placed under suspension and were also placed out of bound from the University campus. The students have been asked to submit their reply to the Proctor within seven days from the receipt of the show cause notice, failing which it will be presumed that they have nothing to say in their defense and exparte action will be initiated against these students.

These students have reportedly used unparliamentary language along with a group of hooligans and ruffians using public address system against the senior University officials and

attempted to disturb law and order in the campus.

Further, it has been reported that some of the students and outsiders with ruffians riding on motor bikes went to different halls of residence, disturbed the students who were busy in preparing for their examinations and also tried to mobilize and force them to reach the Dharna site to destabilize the academic atmosphere of the campus.

Hall (North) and Zafar Saeed of NRSC.

ALIGARH: June 09

The Centre for Distance Education, Aligarh Muslim University is organizing a workshop on 'Self-learning Development and Evaluation'. The five day workshop is focused on identifying the strengths and weaknesses in the study material available for different courses of the Distance Education Centre. It would facilitate the development and improvement of the students' study material

Dr. Rizwan Khan, Director, Centre for Distance Education said that the study material that are available to the students of distance education is not fully fit for the self-learning mode of study. He said that the study material may be evaluated at the level of two factors - internal factors and external factors. This

workshop would focus on the internal factors including language, typographic aspects, word processing, grammar, content etc.

Dr. Khan said that teachers and research scholars from various departments of AMU will participate in the workshop and resource persons from Staff Training and Research Institute of Distance Education, IGNOU will provide training to the participants.

Dr. Rizwan said that that the centre would maintain reporting and documentation.

ALIGARH: June 09

Interdisciplinary Biotechnology Lab at Aligarh Muslim University has developed easy method for the detection of multi-drug resistant NDM-Super bug, said, Dr. Asad Ullah Khan, Associate Professor, Interdisciplinary Biotechnology Unit, AMU.

Dr. Khan said that the major cause of developing drug resistance against different classes of antibiotics is widespread antibiotic usage which may provide a selective force for antibiotic resistant bacteria. Recently, clinical isolates from different sites have been screened for the presence of NDM-1 in the laboratory. Dr. Khan's group has already identified NDM-1 by PCR based detection method in many clinical isolates of different sites and he has established easy detection method in his laboratory. The work on NDM-1 and its other 3 variants has already been started in Dr Khan's laboratory. Dr. Khan has already sequenced the gene and working on the genetics of this gene.

He said that the emergence of NDM-1 in India heralded a new era of multi drug resistance. The NDM-1 carrying bugs are resistant against all antibiotics apart from tigecyclin and colistin and therefore it is difficult to fight with infection caused by NDM-superbug.

Dr. Khan said that NDM-1 was first identified in December 2009 in New Delhi, India. New Delhi Metallo-beta-lactamase, commonly known as "NDM-1", is a gene that makes bacteria resistant to beta-lactam antibiotics. Beta-lactam antibiotics are utilized to treat antibiotic resistant bacteria. Bacteria that are resistant to drug treatment are referred to as "Superbugs". Superbugs may create dangerous infections which are nearly impossible to treat, and resistant to antibiotics. The antibiotic resistance of the NDM1 gene may exponentially accelerate the spread of bacteria that carry it through humans. NDM1 has been detected in bacteria in India, Pakistan, the United States, and the United Kingdom. Currently, NDM1 has been hosted by E.coli bacterium and Klebsiella pneumonia.

ALIGARH: June 08

Addressing a meeting of all Course Coordinators, Centre In-Charges and Observers of various admission tests, AMU Vice Chancellor Prof. P.K. Abdul Azis said that challenging time

passed away and transparency has become our hallmark and it is a testimony to great values of this institution. He said that all the admission tests went off extremely perfect manner. He thanked the University teachers to conduct the tests. He said that for the first time, AMU has conducted admission test in Srinagar and this generated a remarkable excitement in Kashmir.

Prof. Azis said that the decision to sine-die closure of the University was very painful as a group of handful students have paralyzed and they were divided into regionalism and whole administration was puzzled. Some vested interest elements of the University has created rumours and wrong image of the University. He appreciated the role of University teachers who have come forward to protect the image of the University.

Earlier, AMU Registrar, Prof. V.K. Abdul Jaleel thanked all the teachers who have performed their duties successfully in all the entrance test of various courses of the University in and outside the campus. "New radiation-biology technique should be adopted for boosting the production of menthol, an essential oil component of mint plant. This technique is extraordinarily safe, inexpensive, ergonomical and handy", said Dr. Mohd. Masroor Akhtar Khan, Associate Professor, Department of Botany, Aligarh Muslim University while presenting his paper at International Biotechnology Conference organized by American Association of Pharmaceutical Scientists in San Francisco, California, USA.

Prof. Khan said that Menthol is highly useful in making pain-balms, cough syrup, mouthwash, antipruritic (reducing itching) medicines, etc. Using this novel agricultural technique, menthol production may be increased by 40% and even more. The, technique utilizes radiolytically degraded polysaccharides obtained from specific sea-weeds. This work was an output of a

collaborative work with Bhabha Atomic Research Centre (BARC), Mumbai and the Department of Botany, AMU.

This conference was aimed at "Advancing Health through Innovation in Biotherapeutics". More than 1200 scientists participated in this conference. Besides, more than 100 pharmaceutical companies also took part in the conference. Most of the participants were from USA. However, delegates from 30 countries other than USA also attended the conference.

Dr. Khan's work was highly appreciated by the participants. Several companies and many scientists expressed the interest in the technique, asking for future collaborative work in this direction. Dr. Khan is working on medicinal plants for the last 30 years. He has presented his work in USA, Finland, Canada, South Africa, Sri Lanka, Cuba etc. His present trip to attend the aforesaid conference was sponsored by Department of Science and Technology (DST) and Council' of Scientific and Industrial. Research (CSIR), New Delhi.
