SRINAGAR, Mar 13: The annual Sultana Nahar Prizes in Physics introduced and sponsored by Dr. Sultana Nurun Nahar of the Ohio State University, USA were distributed today amongst the students and teachers for distinguished performance in physics discipline during a grand function held at EMMRC auditorium, University of Kashmir.

While distributing the prizes amongst the winners Dr. Nahar who was chief guest on the occasion said that the awards are like incentives to do better work and urged upon both the teachers and students to keep on trying to do better in their academic pursuits with these awards as an inspiration.

She said that these prizes are instituted to encourage and motivate the young students towards the learning of physics discipline and at the same time acknowledge the work of the teachers who have guided the students in acquiring the right kind of education.

Vice Chancellor KU Professor Talat Ahmad, in his presidential address urged the teachers as well as students to not only crave for this award but to aim at awards at the national and international level.
