I was suggested a presentation on "Importance of Outreach program and how I manage them". The topic is broad and the significance is well understood

i) Outreach - is our human duty to reach out to others in need to come aboard with everyone who are advancing.

- The duty is incumbent to leaders who are to bring positive changes in the academic atmosphere or society

- I have been involved in outreach work as human duty all my life, but started systematically in education and research since January 1995. I started at University of Dhaka where I did my B.Sc.Hons and M.Sc before coming to USA Title change from OUTREACH and WOMEN Issues

- What surprised me was that at the conferences I attended almost no one would knew about Dhaka University. There would be one or two participants or none from Bangladesh. The APS (American Physical Society) members would mention only one name - Sultana Nahar - as the one from Bangladesh. So I worked to make a change So I changed the title based on my findings on how to raise the bar of excellence in developing countries What I realized:

- It is not the quality of education but the research that makes an institution known. Education is known knowledge that we need to build our foundation but research brings advances and makes an institution known outside.

- I knew professors who did excellent research outside but slowed down considerably in Bangladesh due to
- i) poor resources,
- ii) less innovative interactions, and
- iii) unfavorable environment

• With a few thousand dollars, in January 1995 I approached Dhaka University which accepted my proposal of recognizing the best research annually by any researcher in Bangladesh

# PROMOTION OF PHYSICS RESEARCH AND EDUCA-TION, Bangladesh

- One visit to Bangladesh brought another need:
- Frustration in students as professors were unavailable at Dhaka University as they were teaching in private universities for extra income
- Students work very hard to get admission in public universities, dream to contribute to science
- Motivation idea for university teachers Recognition for
   i) the best teaching in-class, nominated from students voting,
- ii) the best research publication with students
- Problem with nomination by student votes for the best learning dishonor of cultural prestige
- I make considerable effort to accept the concepts
- University means an inseparable entity of teachers and students for knowledge
- Nomination by voting indicates students appreciation for the best understanding of subject materials in class
- Acceptance of the program has enhanced excellence

# **RECOGNITION PROGRAM FOR PROMOTION OF EDUCATION, Bangladesh**

- I felt obliged to help an old girls high school was on the brink for downsizing from Class X to class VIII
- Teachers would not teach at class but would tutor at high fee outside the school - a common business on earning
- A double shift working parent asked me to support their appeal to waive the school fee of their daughter as the tutor's fee was draining them
- Introduced teachers awards annual for math and science, commerce, arts, and lifetime achievement at retirement
- All annual awards are nominated by students votes based on their learning at class
- The school has bounced back i) it has now high passing rate, ii) more students with higher points, iii) student number has increased from 800 to over 2000, iv) college classes 11 and 12 have been introduced, I am supporting:
- 1 girls college and 1 co-education college
- 1 girls high school, 1 co-education high school
- 2 elementary schools

# HAPPINESS IN WINNING STUDENTS VOTES



- Certificate ceremony at the girls school
- Loud cheers come out from students when their favorite teacher's name is announced as the winner
- The teacher is greatly honored by the achievement. There is no scope of politics in the selection.

PROMOTION OF MATH AND SCIENCE IN MADRASA

- I dared to emphasize math, science, and English in 2008 to the first madrasa outside the Dhaka after donating money to its development
- Students and imams listened as I explained to watch the beautiful sky and think why Allah created it, why doctors need to study about body functions and biology to heal the sufferings from illness, why engineers study to make plane to travel far distance in short time that is science
- The Quran says find out the mystery of the Allah's creations - that needs math and science
- Then I submitted the proposal of recognition program for the teachers and best students which was accepted and bought a computer for them
- One young student stood up during the visit and told me "You are like Mother Theresa"

• Now more students are appearing government board exams and passing them, in 2016 it upgraded its school from 8th to 10th grade so students do not have to go anywhere for the secondary school certificates.

• Being a scientist is very much rewarding. It gives the freedom to think and experience the adventure of finding solutions to challenges. Research gives the joy of getting something new and something useful, and publishing the results in scientific journals means contributing to advancement. When I deliver a scientific presentation, I don't think about me as a woman, I think about my research that is engaging to other scientists.

• Family is very important for us. Taking care of a human being is far more difficult job than anything else, because each human mind thinks independently and hence can always oppose to what you think. Taking care of a family can be most challenging and also be the most rewarding. However, each of us need to nurture and utilize our intellectual power. We need support and time to detach.
